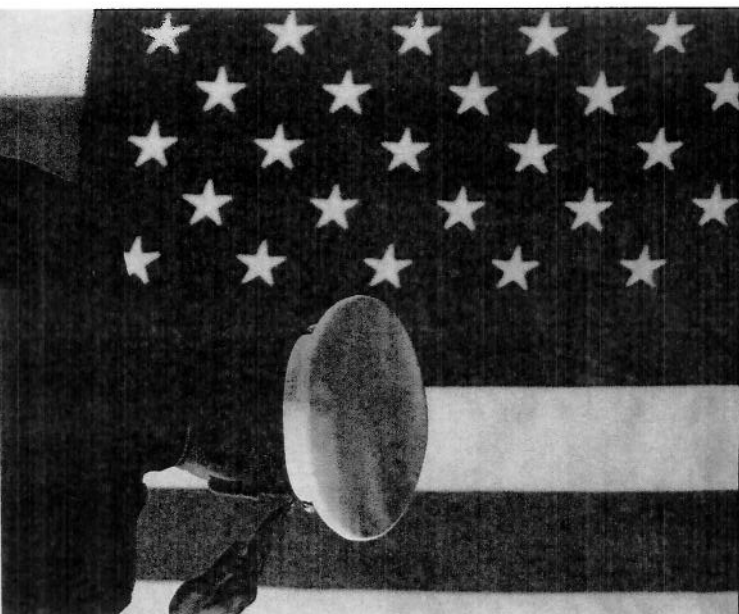

When Founding Volunteer Director Sandra Bower identified the overwhelming needs of our local veterans, she was lead to launch **Vets Returning Home** in October 2013.

Staffed entirely by volunteers, VRH operates an 11,000 sq. ft. facility maintaining 43 beds for veterans in crisis, including the **ONLY** 6 female veteran beds in the state.

Supporting the transition of roughly 140 veterans annually into functioning members of the community, VRH provides transitional housing, disability benefit connection, legal support, employment readiness & placement, life skills training, cooking & nutrition classes, food assistance and, through the generosity of community furniture donations, stable transition into fully furnished apartments.

Our program receives no government funding. Community support, both physical and financial, is vital to continue our mission.

VETERAN HOMELESS CRISIS?

The crisis faced by the American veteran has grown to a tragically overwhelming level in the U.S. Nearly 1.5 million veterans are considered at risk of homelessness.

• In Michigan alone, there are approximately 4,000 homeless veterans on any given day.



- There were 57,849 homeless veterans on any single night in January 2013.
- Just under 8 percent (4,456) were female
- 20% of the male homeless population are veterans
- 12% of the homeless adult population are veterans

Staffed solely by great volunteers who meet the needs of our mission daily, we are inspired and indebted to their love for the American Veteran.
