



Dear Warren Resident:

The year of 2021 was filled with anticipation and excitement about 2022. We are now ready to fulfill a dream of over 50 years for previous administrations by finally having a walkable downtown. Warren residents and others will now have a great destination place for food, fun, and entertainment in our new Towne Center at no cost to Warren residents. It will generate \$200-300 million in new investment, generate \$2.5 million of new tax revenue, 1,000 construction jobs, 500-700 new commercial jobs and the first full-service five star hotel in Macomb County. With money and jobs coming to Warren at no cost to Warren residents, this is a winner since it will ease the tax burden on Warren residents! This will also include a Warren Fire Station for this area, a hospital, a new court, and a new little theatre. This will ultimately encourage new people and new business investments in Warren.

It will also include a new fire station and Ascension-St. John medical facility to serve our community. This project will truly make Warren a destination center for Macomb County and southeast Michigan much in the way Royal Oak and Birmingham have become for Oakland County.

This project is supported by leaders from all sectors across our community. It is supported by business including General Motors, Chrysler/Stellantis, and the Chamber of Commerce. It is supported by labor including the Michigan Building Trades, Council of Carpenters and others. It is supported by bi-partisan political leadership in Macomb County including County Executive Mark Hackel, Public Works Commissioner Candice Miller, Sheriff Anthony Wickersham, Prosecutor Peter Lucido, County Commission Chairman Don Brown and Warren Commissioners Mai Xiong and Michelle Nard. In this era of hyper partisanship it is rare that any project can develop such support, but our new downtown has done it.

Last year we celebrated when the 2020 U.S. Census data showed population growth in Warren for the first time in 50 years. This was the clearest indication yet that the city of Warren is truly on the march toward a better and brighter future and now is the time to step on the accelerator. The Warren Towne Center will serve as a tangible symbol of the bright future our city leaders have dreamed about for generations.

Let us hope that in this year, 2022, we finally begin to see ground being broken, jobs created, steel being erected, and the beginning of the transformation of our great city. A city as great as Warren needs to dream big dreams, and work to build a better future for our children and grandchildren. This project is just such a dream that will not only create opportunity for future generations, but convince that new generation that this is the community to make their home for the long term.

I wish each one of you a happy, healthy, and prosperous New Year. Thank you for continuing to allow me to take your calls and concerns each day. I'm very proud and honored to have the opportunity to serve you as your neighborhood mayor. In 2022, the best is yet to come with your support!










