## Free Document Shredding Day - Warren Residents Only

**Saturday, July 23 - 9 am – 1 pm**

Warren residents and businesses **ONLY** are invited to a free document shredding day Saturday, July 23 from 9 am – 1 pm at Warren City Hall. **I.D.’s required.**

Please put all boxes or bags of paper in your trunk, remain in your vehicle and a worker will take the boxes/bags. There is no contact.

Examples of items that can be shredded are invoices, bank statements, cancelled checks, tax returns, contracts, personal papers, etc.

We ask that each vehicle have a limit of **5 bags or boxes.** Paper clips, binder clips and staples do not need to be removed.

Cardboard boxes will be collected, and all shredded documents will be recycled. The shredding will be done by Shred Corp. For more information, contact Wendy (586) 574-4602.

Available from CivicPlus, a leader in integrated technology for local government, the CivicReady solution will allow the City of Warren to issue urgent notifications, emergency instructions, warnings, and routine communications to subscribe citizens via email, text message, and voicemail alert, to keep citizens safe and informed. ## Up To \$1,000 Fine For Violating Warren’s Fireworks Regulations Seven Important Rules For A Safe 4<sup>th</sup> of July

- Fireworks cannot be discharged while under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs (zero tolerance).
- Minors under the age of 18 are prohibited from discharging fireworks with the exception of low impact fireworks (example: sparklers) under the supervision of a parent or guardian.
- Fireworks cannot be discharged on any street in Warren. Traffic and Emergency vehicles cannot be impeded at any time.
- Discharge of fireworks prohibited in any public park, school property, city streets and sidewalks and easements, including the ITC corridor.
- Discharge of fireworks cannot disrupt the public peace and cannot cause debris on or damage to private and public property.
- Discharging fireworks prohibited within 30 ft. of any house, structure, building, vehicle or landscaping.
- After 11:45 p.m., Warren police will enforce violation of disturbing the peace.
- Sky lanterns are prohibited.
