Dear Friends and Neighbors,

It's great to have the Newsbeat back, and be able to inform you of all the great things going on in Warren. We have transformational projects taking place in Warren that will provide more jobs, more revenue, and more recreational places for our residents. Whether it be the proposed Downtown project or the rehabilitation of the transmission plant, more income and jobs are coming to Warren!

One place where I know we will begin moving toward a better future is at the corner of 9 Mile and Mound on the southwest side of our community. That is the location of the old GM Transmission plant that was closed in 2019. Recently it was announced that GM had sold the facility to NorthPointe Development which plans to invest \$180 million in redeveloping the facility. This old eyesore will be turned into 2,000,000 square feet of new commercial and industrial space, and will provide up to 600 jobs. It will likely be the home to either an international or national company. This is transformational for this area of Warren taking a blighted building creating jobs and income for the city. A great example of a public-private partnership such as the proposed Towne Center!

This year will also mark transformations across Warren city parks. This includes the beginning of construction on the new Tony Hawk Skate Park that will provide Warren kids a state-of-the-art facility to show off their skills. We also will open the new splash pad at Wiegand Park and continue the work to upgrade bathroom facilities and playscapes across each of our wonderful city parks. Our parks are a great source of pride for our community and offer kids and adults alike great opportunities to enjoy the outdoors in our wonderful city. In 2022, our parks will take a great step forward to an even better future! My goal is to always serve and protect Warren citizens and provide more recreational outlets for Warren families.


I was glad that the city council finally held a discussion and vote about our new proposed walkable downtown area that would provide a centerpiece development for our community that would fulfill hopes of city leaders for more than 50 years. I was disappointed that council didn't approve the project, but I'm committed to continuing to work in good faith with city council in the coming weeks and months to reconsider their decision and move this cornerstone project for our city forward.



# City of Warren Lead Hazard Reduction Grants Available IS YOUR HOME LEAD SAFE?

Many homes in Warren contain lead hazards that put children at risk. The City of Warren provides grants for the repairs needed to ensure your home is safe and lead-free.

The City of Warren Lead Hazard Control Program makes grants available to eligible "low" and "moderate" income households occupied by children under six years, or pregnant women. These grant funds may only be used to pay for eligible lead hazard remediation work completed at eligible homes.

The maximum lead hazard control grant the City will make is \$20,000. Applicants who qualify for the program will be eligible for a deferred loan, which will be forgiven if the applicant resides in the property for 3 years. The home to be repaired must be located in the City of Warren. The house must have been built before 1978 and have lead-based paint hazards. The City is accepting applications.

Applications for loans are processed in the order they are received. Households with a child having an elevated blood lead level above 5 mg/dl will be given priority and the application will receive priority processing. There must be a resident child 0-5 years of age who lives in the home. Children in regular daycare and pregnant women are included. Applicants must agree to provide the City of Warren and/or HUD with any information requested in order to verify compliance with the program requirements.

#### ATTENTION HOMEOWNERS: HOME REPAIR LOANS AVAILABLE



The City of Warren's Residential Rehabilitation Program is accepting applications from income-eligible households for low or no interest loans.

The loans are used to bring the home up to code and make repairs to owner-occupied single-family residences. The maximum loan amount is \$30,000. To qualify for the program, applicants must own and occupy the home, have homeowner's insurance, have a history of making house and property tax payments (including the water bill) on time, and have a household income that is below the limits established by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD):
