Dear Friends and Neighbors,

As we enter the summer season I want to let every Warren resident know that our administration continues the work to improve the quality of life in our community.

We continue to work to move the Warren Towne Center project forward. This \$170 million project would create a new walkable downtown with dining, shopping, a hotel and entertainment venues that would make Warren a destination in southeast Michigan. And all of it would be created at no cost to city residents. Just think how nice it would be on a beautiful summer evening to be able to walk to nice shops, pubs, restaurants or even live in one of the new loft apartments. This dream is still possible to come true with action from city council. I won't stop working to make this dream a reality.

We aren't only focused on the new downtown, but also on improving our world class parks. This summer you will see upgrades to bathroom facilities, playground equipment, landscaping and other amenities that help make our parks a treasure for our kids, our families, and our entire community. Make sure you go check them out at some point this summer.

Planning continues for a state-of-the-art skate park that will give our kids and grandkids a place to show off their skills on bikes and skateboards. This innovative project would also stand out in the region and give our young people another great outlet away from screens to enjoy the outdoors.

None of us who lived through the massive flooding of 2014 will ever forget it. Torrential rains overwhelmed our infrastructure causing over \$1.2 billion in damages to homes, vehicles and businesses across our city, and even more across the region in southeast Michigan. Since that time my administration has taken action to improve infrastructure to protect against such a catastrophe from ever happening again.

Last summer, while every rain seemed to bring a new flooding event to our neighbors in the region, Warren homes were largely protected from the steps we've taken. We continue to move forward building a detention basin that will collect excessive rain water instead of sending it into residents basements. This investment protects our residents, our businesses and the assurance we need when it begins to rain.

The people of Warren are incredible and deserve a government focused on protecting and serving their interests. That's exactly what this administration is doing, and will always do. So enjoy the summer, check out our parks, enjoy the butterflies, and everything our great city has to offer!

Warren Parks and Recreation offers transportation Services for eligible seniors.

Senior and Disabled Transportation Services: A Service to help seniors and disabled persons remain independent for life.

Hours of Operation:

Monday-Friday: 8:00-2:30 p.m.
*All appointments MUST be concluded by 2:30 p.m. If you go beyond our transportation hours of 2:30pm, you must make your own arrangements for transportation home.

Transportation office hours:

Monday-Friday: 7:30am-2:30 p.m. Phone: 586-268-0551

- Who is Eligible for Transportation:Any Warren or Centerline resident who is 55 years of age or older, or disabled individuals.
- All appointments must be scheduled through the Transportation Aide in office.
- Please make your requests 3-4 weeks in advance. NO day of requests.
- There are a specific number of appointment slots each day. They will all be taken on a first call/first serve básis.
- Passengers must be able to get from their home to the curb on their own. You are allowed to bring your own aide for assistance. They must stay with you on the bus for the duration of your trip.

 Drivers are only allowed to leave the bus to assist
- customers on/off the lift.
- Service area is within the City of Warren/Centerline and 1 mile outside of the city limits of Warren. (North, East & West)
- Canceled appointments must be done at least 2 days in advance.

Medical Appointments:

- ALL medical appointments should be scheduled 11:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m. NO appointments will be taken before 11:00 a.m. or after 2:00 p.m.
- If you have to wait after you have seen the doctor. please be patient, as we have other customers to pick up/drop off.
- ALL appointments are a donation of \$4.00 per person (\$2.00 each way).



- Pick up time for shopping trips will be between 8:30 a.m. - 10:30 a.m. We cannot specify an exact time. Please be patient.
- The shopping limit is two shopping bags per person and you must carry/load your own bags.
 All shopping trips are a donation of \$2.00 per person (\$1.00 each way).
 Passengers are dropped off for 2 hours of
- shopping.
- The schedule for shopping: Tuesday-Meijer (12 mile & Mound)

Wednesday-WalMart (12 mile & Van Dyke) Hair Salons/Barber Shops

ALL appointments can be scheduled only for Thursdays & Fridays, after 11 a.m.

Municipal Credit Tickets-SMART

Who is Eligible:

- Seniors beginning at age 60 or disabled individuals. Warren Residents ONLY.
- Bus tickets can only be used for SMART transportation.
- You will be eligible for 60 tickets, every two months, worth .50 cents each.
- To register for the program: Call 586-268-8400,
- Monday-Friday (9 a.m. -7 p.m.)
 Once registered, call 586-268-8400 at least 2 days prior to request your tickets.
 When picking up tickets, you will need to show proof of your Warren Residency with a picture I.D. must have the Warren address and your age on it). Proof of Disability requires a note from your Doctor (on their letterhead, with Doctors name, address & phone number), dated within the last 30 days.

You may pick up your tickets at either of the listed locations:

- Warren Community Center (5460 Arden, south of 14 mile, west of Mound), 9am-7pm.
- Fitzgerald Rec. Center (4355 E. 9 mile, east of Ryan Rd.)

Call 586-268-8400 two days prior to reserve your tickets. Pick up your tickets Tuesdays or Thursdays, 10 a.m. - 1p.m.
