

## **NOTICE OF CONSTRUCTION**

### **Beierman Avenue Reconstruction and Water Main Replacement (9 Mile Road to Stephens Road)**

As part of the City of Warren's commitment to maintain the City's infrastructure, the City will be reconstructing the pavement along Beierman Avenue between 9 Mile Road and Stephens Road including replacement of the existing water main and water services. The project is scheduled to begin on the week of June 6, 2022 and is expected to be open to traffic around late October, 2022. Work during the week of May 30, 2022 may include delivery of traffic control devices and tree removals along both sides of the road to accommodate the road and water main replacement.

Regular work hours during construction will be 7:00 am to 7:30 pm, Monday thru Friday. If Saturday work is necessary, the working hours will be 8:00 am thru 7:30 pm. During the concrete pavement activities, extended working hours may be necessary to allow the contractor to saw cut relief joints into the new pavement to avoid random cracks.

The project will be completed in two (2) stages to maintain traffic access and to provide a safe working and staging area for the contractor. Appropriate temporary traffic control and signage will be placed to provide guidance.

During the week of June 6, 2022 and possibly a few days earlier, the Contractor will have fully set up traffic control for stage one and begin the water main replacement, storm sewer replacement, and pavement replacement. The east side of the road will be closed and traffic flow will be directed south from Stephens Road towards 9 Mile Road. While the water main work progresses, the contractor will begin the storm sewer replacement. Sections of the roadway may be temporarily closed to allow the contractor to place the storm sewer across the entire road and provide appropriate safety for all. Temporary closures would last no more than a day, and the contractor will work with residents to allow them access to their homes. If a temporary closure is in place, residents will be directed to use, 9 Mile Road, or Stephens Road as a detour. Once the water main and storm sewer work are completed, the contractor will begin replacing the pavement along the east side of the road. Residents impacted by the pavement activities will be asked to park on a nearby side street until the concrete is placed and ready to open. After the pavement, driveway and sidewalk work on the east side is completed, the contractor will shift the traffic control to the west side of the road and start removing the replacing the pavement. The anticipated timeframe for the traffic control shift is early-September. During the west half closure, traffic flow will be directed north, 9 Mile Road towards Stephens Road.

It will be necessary to temporarily close a driveway or side street to allow for water main and/or storm sewer installation. The exact locations of the temporary closures are not known at this time, but will be coordinated in advance with the resident by the field representative assigned to the project. Additional notices will be distributed to residents throughout construction to provide information on upcoming paving activities and traffic staging changes.

There will be times during the water main replacement when property owners may experience brief interruptions to their water services. All reasonable efforts will be made by the City and the Contractor to notify affected property owners prior to any water service interruptions. It is suggested that property owners keep extra drinking water on hand, as well as, a five-gallon bucket of water for flushing the toilet. Not every interruption is predictable and there may be instances where the water is turned off without notice.

During the course of the water main replacement, the City will be operating valves and flushing hydrants in the water main system. This may cause a temporary discoloration of water. If you are experiencing any discoloration of water, check the water every 30 minutes to see if it has cleared by running the cold water for a few minutes. Avoid drinking, washing clothes or cooking with it until it clears up. If after 2-3 hours there is no improvement, please contact the Engineering Division at (586) 759-9300.

**We realize there will be inconveniences during construction, however it is our intention to address as many concerns as can be reasonably accommodated, keeping in mind that portions of the road and driveways must be closed to complete work. We apologize for the inconveniences this will create; however with your cooperation, we can help to expedite the completion of the project.**

Please continue to place garbage, compost, and recycling containers curbside as normal. It is recommended that property owners place their address on garbage or recycling containers. Mail service to your property will be uninterrupted during construction.
