Home Repair Loans Available

The City of Warren's Residential Rehabilitation Program is accepting applications from income-eligible households for low or no interest loans. The loans are used to bring the home up to code and make repairs to owner-occupied single-family residences. The maximum loan amount is \$30,000. To qualify for the Program, applicants must own and occupy the home, have homeowner's insurance, have a history of making house and property tax payments (including the water bill) on time, and have a household income that is below the limits established by The Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD):

Free Document Shredding Day - Warren Residents Only

Saturday, July 23 - 9 am – 1 pm

Warren residents and businesses ONLY are invited to a free document shredding day Saturday, July 23 from 9 am – 1 pm at Warren City Hall. I.D.'s required.

Please put all boxes or bags of paper in your trunk, remain in your vehicle and a worker will take the boxes/bags. There is no contact.

Examples of items that can be shredded are invoices, bank statements, cancelled checks, tax returns, contracts, personal papers, etc.

We ask that each vehicle have a limit of 5 bags or boxes. Paper clips, binder clips and staples do not need to be removed.

Cardboard boxes will be collected, and all shredded documents will be recycled. The shredding will be done by Shred Corp. For more information, contact Wendy (586) 574-4602.
