The beginning of winter in Warren is a festive time of the year. It marks start of the most festive time of the year and the end of our wonderful Fall.

Warren City Hall is decorated in Christmas colors with a new bigger and better Christmas tree! We will be ending another successful Salvation Army Toy and non-perishable food drive at the Mayor's Office. Thanks to generous Warren residents, many children and adults will have a good Christmas.

In 2023, our goals are new development, a safer and cleaner city, new ways to lessen the economic burden on residents, and new ways of doing things.

Goal #1 continues to be to have a destination place for Warren citizens and metro-area residents to come to Warren. A Towne Center continues to be at the forefront of my goals because it does the following:

- 1) Generates new revenue for the city to lessen the tax burden on Warren residents
- 2) Creates 1,000 construction jobs
- 3) Creates 500-700 or more commercial jobs
- 4) Creates a walkable Towne Center for Warren residents
- 5) Creates an investment of \$250,000,000 of new investment in Warren
- 6) Guarantees NO tax burden on Warren residential taxpayers
- 7) Eliminates a loss of \$7-10 million dollars that is lost to residents shopping and entertaining in other downtown areas such as Detroit, Royal Oak, Ferndale, Birmingham, and Rochester
- 8) Encourages new businesses to locate in Warren
- 9) Encourages people from other cities to spend their entertainment and shopping money in
- 10) Makes Warren a destination place to go to. Instills pride in being a Warren resident.

Public Safety

The New Year will start work on two new fire stations* and the latest equipment to fight fires and take care of EMS emergency runs. Fire Department will be up to a full staff. Warren Fire has received the gold award for being the best fire department in the state for 8 years and one silver (Silver was the top award in the first year). *Station #1 at South Civic Center (Van Dyke and Continental) *Station #5 at Van Dyke just south of 13 mile. Fire Commissioner Skip McAdams is responsible for the success of our awardwinning Fire Department.

The Police Department will be up to full staff. This department will go into the New Year with being the largest Police Department in the state to have full accreditation. Police are equipped with body cameras. Police will also be highly trained to deal with various large and small-scale incidents. Neighborhood patrols will increase as well. The Police Department now has 41% more police officers on patrol than what they had in 2017. In 2017, Bill Dwyer became Police Commissioner for the second time.



Swim Classes

PRE-SCHOOL PROGRAM AGES, 4 AND UNDER

Parent-Infant: With the parent's assistance, infants will learn water adjustment and basic water skills. Skills will be introduced

through games, songs, and activities. Swim diaper and plastic pants required. For ages, 2 and under.

Parent-Tot: With the parent's assistance, toddlers will focus on water exploration, floating, basic locomotion, stroke readiness and stroke development. Skills will be introduced through games, songs, and activities. Swim diaper and plastic

pants required for those under 3. For ages, 2 to 4.

Preschool 1: For children who are in class for the first time without a parent. Focuses on enjoyment in and on water adjustment (students do not go underwater). Students are supported by a teacher for all skills. For ages, 3-4.

For children who are not afraid of the water. This class will build upon basic swimming skills so children can gain **Preschool 2:** more confidence in the water. Students begin to go underwater and float, glide, kick, and swim with little to no

assistance in this class. For ages, 3-4.

Students will float, glide, kick and swim with no assistance. Students will perform skills for longer durations/greater distances. Must be able to go underwater and swim on the front and back unassisted before enrolling. For ages, 3-4.

LEVEL PROGRAMS-AGES, 5 AND UP

Students will work on increasing comfort in the water. Class objectives include full underwater bobs along and floating in the front and back with little to no assistance. For ages, 5-10.

Level 2: For those who are ready to learn the foundations of front and back swimming. Students must be able to float with little or no assistance before enrolling. Previous swim lesson experience highly recommended. Ages, 5-10.

Level 3: Students will learn correct technique for front crawl/elementary backstroke and will be introduced to dolphin kick, scissors kick and treading water. Must pass Level 2 or be able to swim 10 yards unassisted on the front and back before

Level 4: Students will increase endurance for front crawl/elementary backstroke. Participants will learn the backcrawl, sidestroke, breaststroke and butterfly. Class is held in deep water; must pass Level 3 before enrolling. Ages, 6-14.

Students will work on coordination and refinement of strokes to increase endurance and efficiency while swimming.

Flip turns will be introduced. Students must know all six strokes before enrolling. Ages, 7-14.

Students will continue with refinement of strokes in order to swim with more ease, efficiency, power and smoothness over greater distances. Fitness elements will be taught to students. Must be proficient in all six strokes before enrolling. Ages, 8-14.

TEEN PROGRAM-AGES, 10-15

This class is for students that have minimal swimming experience. Students will learn how to float, glide, kick Beginner Teen:

and swim on the front and back. This class is for students who cannot do skills independently. Ages, 10-15. This class is for students who can already float, glide, kick and swim on the front and back. Students will be

Intermediate Teen: taught proper form and technique for swimming front and backcrawl. Rhythmic breathing, elementary

backstroke, and breaststroke will be introduced. Ages, 10-15.

Advanced Teen: This class is for students that can proficiently swim the front and back crawl, elementary backstroke and

breaststroke. Sidestroke and butterfly will be introduced. Students will begin to learn advanced techniques

such as turns, and will begin distance/endurance swimming. Ages, 10-15.

ADULT PROGRAM-AGES, 16 AND UP

For those that have never swam before and have a fear of the water. Class focuses on becoming comfortable in **Beginner Adult:**

and around the water. Skills will include going underwater, floating, gliding, kicking and swimming with the

assistance of a floatation device and/or instructor if necessary.

For those that have completed the Beginner class or are comfortable in the water. Students should be able **Intermediate Adult:**

to swim independently before enrolling. Class focuses on various strokes such as the front crawl, back crawl, breaststroke, elementary backstroke, sidestroke and butterfly. Correct form/technique will be taught.

For those who are strong swimmers and want to get a swim team type workout. This class will include proper

stretches, warm-ups, workouts and cool downs.

GROUP SWIM LESSONS


Advanced Adults:

Classes are once per week, 30 minutes. No make-ups or refunds due to missed classes. If the pool is closed due to maintenance issues or inclement weather, a make-up class will be scheduled at the end of the session. No refunds after the first class. Refunds will only be processed by the Aquatic Supervisor or Swim Lesson Coordinator. Facility usage is NOT included in swim lesson fees. Please refer to the class descriptions to determine the appropriate placement of your student. It is highly encouraged if unsure of student placement to attend the free testing day.

Warren Parks and Recreation offers transportation services for eligible seniors.

Senior and Disabled **Transportation Services:** A Service to help seniors and disabled persons remain independent for

Hours of Operation:

Monday-Friday: 8 a.m.-2 p.m. *All appointments MUST be concluded by 2 p.m. If you go beyond our transportation hours of 2 p.m., you must make your own arrangements for transportation home.

Transportation office hours: Monday-Friday: 7:30 a.m.-2:30 p.m. Phone: 586-268-0551

Who is Eligible for **Transportation:**

- Any Warren or Center Line resident who is 55 years of age or older, or disabled individuals.
- All appointments must be scheduled through the Transportation Aide in office. Please make your requests 3-4 weeks in advance. NO day of
- requests.
- There are a specific number of appointment slots each day. They will all be taken on a first call/first serve basis.
- Passengers must be able to get from their home to the curb on their own. You are allowed to bring your own aide for assistance. They must stay with you on the bus for the duration of your trip.
- Drivers are only allowed to leave the bus to assist customers on/off the lift.
- Service area is within Warren/

Center Line and one mile outside of the city limits of Warren. (North, East & West)

Canceled appointments must be done at least two days in advance.

Medical Appointments:

- ALL medical appointments should be scheduled between 10:30 a.m. or after 1 p.m. NO appointments will be taken before 10:30 a.m. or after 1
- If you have to wait after you have seen the doctor, please be patient, as we have other customers to pick up/drop off.
- ALL appointments are a donation of \$4.00 per person (\$2.00 each way).

- Shopping:Pick up time for shopping trips will be between 8 a.m.-10 a.m. We cannot specify an exact time. Please be patient.
- The shopping limit is two shopping bags per person and you must carry/load your own bags.
- All shopping trips are a donation of \$2.00 per person (\$1.00 each way).
 Passengers are dropped off for
- 2 hours of shopping. The schedule for shopping
- is: Tuesday-Meijer (12 mile & Mound) and Wednesday-WalMart (12 mile & Van Dyke)

ALL appointments must be scheduled for Thursdays & Fridays after 10:30 a.m.

Municipal Credit Tickets-SMART

- Who is Eligible:Seniors beginning at age 60 or disabled individuals.
- Warren Residents ONLY.
- Bus tickets can only be used for SMART transportation.
- You will be eligible for 60 tickets, every two months, worth .50 cents each.
- To register for the program: Call 586-268-8400, Monday-Friday (9 a.m. -7 p.m.)
- Once registered, call 586-268-8400 at least two days prior to request your tickets.
- When picking up tickets, you will need to show proof of your Warren Residency with a picture I.D. (must have the Warren address and your age on it). Proof of Disability requires a note from your doctor (on their letterhead, with doctor's name, address and phone number), dated within the last 30 days.

You may pick up your tickets at either of the listed locations:

1000 Books Before Kindergarten



The Warren Public Library's "1000 Books Before Kindergarten" program encourages families to read 1000 books with their children before they begin kindergarten. Numerous studies estimate that as many

as one in five children have difficulties learning to read. Reading has been associated as an early indicator of academic success. Public formal education does not typically start until ages 5 to 6. Before then parents and caregivers are the first education providers during the 0-5 early critical years. The "1000 Books Before Kindergarten" challenge is a simple and very manageable endeavor. If you read 3 books every night for one year you will have read 1095 books. Parents can stop by any Warren Public Library branch to receive a packet of information to keep track of the books that they read to their child. Participants will earn special incentives along the way as they work towards the goal of 1000 books, such as a tote bag, free book, and stickers. Children who complete the program will receive an award certificate.

Telescopes Available for Checkout



As a NASA@ My Library partner, the Warren Public Library received four circulating telescopes through grant funding and a generous donation from the Grosse Pointe Public Library. In partnership with the Warren Astronomical Society, the libraries will offer telescope events throughout the year, as

well as the opportunity to check out the telescope and use it to view the night sky at home. Each Warren Public Library branch has a telescope for Warren residents to check out with a valid library card. A telescope may be checked out to Warren residents ages 18 years or older for 7 days with no renewals. Each household can check out a telescope once every thirty days. Visit any Warren Public Library branch for more information.

The Library Telescope program is a national initiative that began in 2008 to give greater access to telescopes and to check them out at public libraries, just as books are checked out.











Warren Snow Removal Policy

Warren city ordinance requires that all property owners remove snow from their sidewalks 12 hours after the snow stops. This applies to all property owners, residential, commercial and industrial. Where there is no sidewalk, the occupant or owner shall clear a path free from snow and ice where sidewalks would otherwise be to facilitate pedestrian use.

Keep Pets Safe

- A good rule of thumb is: if you're cold, then your pet is cold.
- Don't leave your pets outside for long periods. When they are outside, make sure they have warm and dry shelter with access to food and water that is not frozen.
- Dry off your pets when they come back inside. Examine their paws and remove any salts, chemicals, or snowballs to prevent irritation or poisoning.

REMINDER!!!

Please write your address on your trash, recycle and compost carts. In the event of a storm and the cans blow away, you will know which can is yours. Also, please make sure the garbage can lids are securely closed. Lids must be closed tight with nothing hanging out the side in order for the arm on the truck to pick it up and empty properly.

Stay Warm and Safe this Winter

Proper Space Heater Use

Space heaters can be great for extra heat in rooms that tend to be colder than others (from either lack of proper insulation or basement living spaces). Remember to turn them off when leaving the room or going to bed. Keep them at least 3 feet from flammable items, like fabric or bedding. This also goes for children and pets, because of potential burning hazards. Always use the right kind of fuel for fuel burning space heaters. If you find that your usage of space heaters is increasing, then you should have your furnace inspected to make sure you are getting maximum efficiency output.

Check Your Chimneys and Vents

Fireplaces can produce creosote which has the capability of igniting. If your family lights the fireplace often, you most likely need an annual chimney inspection to make sure that there are no hazards capable of starting a fire. It's important to always remember that when burning wood, use dry, seasoned wood which produces more flame with less smoke.

Have Your Furnace Checked

Although this is something that many people believe they can do themselves, it is often safer to invest in hiring a professional to come and inspect your furnace annually. It's always better to know when something is not working properly than to have it abruptly break down in those cold winter months when you need heat the most.
