



In 2023, my administration is focused on challenges and improvements in our neighborhood services, including more police patrols, quicker response to various neighborhood problems and ongoing efforts to improve city services such as more policemen and firemen to respond to neighborhood safety issues, more improvement to our neighborhood roads, and a focus on bringing more new services to our city such as a new Towne Center and a new Skateboard park.

Winter always presents many challenges. Know that the city Public Works Department is ready to meet every challenge. They stand on call 24 hours a day to keep our streets clear of snow or deal with water main breaks that can occur at any time. Our goal is always to minimize the inconvenience and stress on our residents, businesses and industry so that life can go on as close to normal as possible as we deal with cold weather events. I will continue to handle calls related to snow covered roads and sidewalks not cleared. I'm always available 24/7 at both home and work to make sure your concerns are taken care of! Call me at (586) 574-4520.

In the spring, you will see exciting new improvements, particularly to our parks. Last year I signed an emergency purchase order to fund overdue maintenance in our parks. We have been working to improve playscapes for our children and new clean restroom facilities for all. We continue to strive to improve landscaping including mowing, tree management, hedge trimming and sidewalk improvements. I assure you your experience in our parks will be greatly improved in 2023.

In 2022, I started a big project aimed at protecting pollinators like bees and butterflies whose populations have been dramatically declining due to encroachment of development and overuse of pesticides. We have created bee refuges by placing hives at the Warren Police Station, Fire Station #6, the Warren Community Center, and Civic Center South. Bees improve the eco-system by pollinating plants, beautifying parks and gardens, and promoting fruiting and seed production. Our butterfly refuges should also be in place by this spring, so get ready to see more bees and butterflies helping to beautify our community.

We are very careful in the attempt to protect pollinating insects through avoiding the overuse of pesticides. We do use mosquito briquettes in our catch basins, but those only attack mosquito larvae and not other insects. Please avoid the use of pesticides for your grass, as not only does it kill weeds but also butterflies, bees, and other friendly and beneficial creatures. If it kills butterflies and bees what can it do to our dogs and cats as well as children and adults! You can protect against mosquitos by ensuring you do not have standing water in your yard and other protections. Let us all do our part to keep our Warren community beautiful! Note: Dandelions are a good food source for butterflies and bees. Dandelions in many cultures is a healthy food source so spraying dandelions kills many good insects.

Throughout this year we will also continue to work to finally make the Warren Towne Center a reality. This \$170 million project would create a new walkable downtown with dining, shopping, an upscale hotel and entertainment venues that would make Warren a destination in southeast Mich-

igan. And all of it would be created at no cost to city residents. Just think how nice it would be on a beautiful summer evening to be able to walk to nice shops, pubs, restaurants or even live in one of the new loft apartments. The plans are in place, our team is ready to go, workers are ready to build, and it's all still possible to come true with action from city council. I stand ready, as always, to work with council to make this dream a reality.

We have come such a long way in recent years. We survived the great recession and the COVID-19 pandemic and came back even stronger. Evidence of that fact was the 2020 census that showed for the first time in 50 years, Warren actually had population growth. Together we can achieve anything, and I will work as hard as possible to make 2023 Warren's best year ever!

Finally, we face the challenge of rising prices and the need for more income and convenient places to shop. The Towne Center will generate \$250,000,000 in new investment for the city as well as a new tax revenue to help fund needed projects without a tax increase. That is why the Towne Center allows the city to grow with more investment and more people to lessen the burden on our taxpayers. This new development is necessary if our city is to grow and prosper!

FISCAL 2023 GENERAL FUND EXPENDITURES








