WELCOME TO THE CLEANER WARREN TEAM!

The City of Warren is pleased you've joined the Warren Adopt-A-Road team. Together, we'll keep our city roadsides clean and attractive.

It's a big job, and we want the experience to be as safe and enjoyable as possible. Please read these safety rules carefully before taking on your first assignment.

General Safety Rules

- Road traffic travels at high speeds, and most drivers don't expect to see crews working along the roadside. Be alert and use good common sense at all times!
- Crew members should be in good health with good sight and hearing.
- Minors must be under adult supervision and comply with all the requirements in this brochure.
- One person should be designated crew leader to ensure safety rules are followed by everyone.

Safety Rules

- Carpool to the site to reduce the number of vehicles on the roadside.
- All vehicles should be parked well off the right shoulder. Do not park on paved shoulders or in roadway.
- Parking is not allowed along curves, on bridges, near or under overpasses, or in roadway medians.
- All occupants in vehicles should exit and enter the vehicle on the side opposite traffic.
- Keep vehicles on the same side of the road as crew members.
- Work only one side of the roadway at a time 💰

- Knives, machetes, axes, etc. should not be carried by crew members.
- Don't overfill or compact trash bags because of the danger of injuries from broken or jagged objects.
- Fill bags with what goes in easily; then start with a new bag.
- Keep crews together for better visibility to motorists.
- Use safe turn-around points when changing directions.

Protect Yourself and Other Crew Members

- ▲ Never walk out onto the roadway.
- ▲ Face oncoming traffic as you work whenever possible. Be prepared to move out of the way of vehicles in an emergency.
- ▲ Post a person to look out for traffic dangers.
- ▲ Have a refresher session on safety awareness each time a crew goes out.
- ▲ Work during daylight hours only.
- ▲ Stop working in bad weather, especially when there is poor visibility and wet or icy roads.
- Avoid the use of headsets.
- Wear high visibility safety vests while working on the roadside. Other clothes should be lightcolored for increased visibility.
- ▲ Wear heavy gloves.
- Wear a hat and long-sleeved top to avoid sunburn. Sunscreen lotion is recommended for sunny days.
- ▲ Watch your footing. Wear substantial leather shoes or boots with good ankle support. Stay off loose stones and steep slopes.
- Avoid overexertion. Drink lots of water, especially on hot, humid days.

How to Participate

It's easy to "Adopt-A-Warren-Road." Business, church and school groups, service clubs, scouting groups, or neighborhood associations with six or more members (no political groups or individuals) who agree to clean a section of a local road, four to six times a year for a two-year period are eligible to Adopt-A-Warren-Road.

If you are interested in any roads not included in the list, they are either a state or county road and not a citymaintained road.

Adopt-A-Warren-Road Guidelines

- Adoption entitles your group to an Adopt-A-Warren-Road sign with your group's name on it.
- 2. Adopt-A-Warren-Road agreement is valid for a two-year period.
- Notify the Public Works Department of your scheduled clean-up day to reserve bags and safety vests for your group. Work gloves are your group's responsibility.
- All sides of the road must be cleaned. (Includes ditches, medians, municipal rights of way, adjoining fields up to 200 ft.) NOT THE ROAD.
- Adopted road shall be cleaned a minimum of 4 times a year or more, if needed between April and October.
- 6. Safety vests (available through Public Works) *must* be worn at all times.
- Do not compact, smash or push down full bags. Start a new bag to avoid sharp or dangerous objects. Large objects do not need to be put in bag; place next to full bag.
- Groups should consist of six or more people. Please identify the names, addresses and phone numbers of your contact person with the Public Works Department at (586) 759-9270.
- In case of rain or any other delays, please notify Public Works of your alternate date.
- Crew members must be at least 16 years of age and/or supervised by an adult.
- Please notify the Public Works Dept. if you are no longer interested in cleaning your road, so it may be readopted.
