The link below will allow you to access the Warren City Clerk's Official website and see, in a larger version, the map we have attached. The map will also show you the precinct where you can vote in-person.





Please put all boxes or bags of paper in your trunk, remain in your vehicle and a worker will take the boxes/bags. There is no contact.

Examples of items that can be shredded are invoices, bank statements, cancelled checks, tax returns, contracts, personal papers, etc.

We ask that each vehicle have a limit of <u>5 bags or boxes.</u> Paper clips, binder clips and staples do not need to be removed.

Use an absorbent bib or collar, available at most boating shops, to collect any spills during refueling. Wipe up any drips from re-fueling. The Coast Guard recommends filling tanks to 90% to allow for expansion due to heat, and to revent evertiles.



DEALING WITH SPILLS and to prevent overfills.

Immediately report any spills to the marina. In open wate call the U.S. Coast Guard National Response Center (1-800-424-8802). Never use dish soap or detergent to



BLACK WATER It harder to collect. Spill responses will vary depending on location, material, and amount spilled.

This is the sewage from your on-board bathroom. While there are various systems available, dumping them directly into the lake is always illegal. Systems should be checked for leaks and manufactures and state.
