Sadly, the current city council did not like it and chose to defund it and thus terminate it for the good people of Warren. Therefore, I thank all of you for the opportunity to serve your needs including what is going on in the city via the Newsbeat.

As you can see by a sample listing that Fall is a time for celebration with great festivities throughout the next three months. The months of September, October, and November allow us to enjoy the outdoors amongst our friends with something for everyone! Great holiday events including Halloween and Thanksgiving along with the feeling of the Fall.

I want to thank all of you who supported me during my 16 years as your mayor. Every day and every year has been a festive event dedicated to serving and protecting you the residents of Warren. While I may not be here for the grand opening of the Detention Basin designed to curtail basement and street flooding I know that it will make a difference in the quality of life for many Warren residents who have been victims of basement flooding.

With a new reform City Council, I believe Warren will move forward and we can have a walkable Downtown Towne Center with upscale shopping and entertainment areas along with upscale lofts. This New Towne Center will generate \$2.5 million dollars of new tax revenue along with \$250,000,000 investment in our city. This will encourage more growth in both population and business investment. It will create 1,000 construction jobs and hundreds of commercial jobs. Warren's Towne Center will become the destination place for both residents and those from other cities who desire a friendly and safe place to shop or to entertain themselves. I have requested a vote by this city council nearly 40 times, but they refused to do so. This would not have cost the residential taxpayers one cent.

With a new reform City Council, we will be able to refurbish our Parks and Recreation department with new bathrooms, new pavilions, new safe play structures, and new playing fields for soccer, baseball, and cricket. Above all else, we will have clean and safe parks. This current council refused to allocate money available for the parks.

Other areas should also get much needed funding by a new reform City Council. I see a fulfillment of what my administration tried to achieve with an intransigent city council, being achieved by a new reform Council. Warren will be a new and exciting place under a new beginning, which means to 'Move Warren Forward'. The Best is yet to come with new positive leadership.

Thanks for your support and your support for goals not yet achieved but will be achieved for a better future for all Warren residents!



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Swim Classes

PRE-SCHOOL PROGRAM AGES, 4 AND UNDER

Baby & Me:	With the parent's or adult's assistance, infants will learn water adjustment and basic water skills. Skills will be introduced through games, songs, and activities. Swim diaper and plastic pants required. For ages, 2 and under.
Tot & Me:	With the parent's or adult's assistance, toddlers will focus on water exploration, floating, basic locomotion, stroke readiness and stroke development. Skills will be introduced through games, songs, and activities. Swim diaper and
	plastic pants required for those under 3. For ages, 2 to 4.
Preschool 1:	For children who are in class for the first time without a parent. Focuses on enjoyment in and on water adjustment (students do not go underwater). Students are supported by a teacher for all skills. For ages, 3-4.
Preschool 2:	For children who are not afraid of the water. This class will build upon basic swimming skills so children can gain more confidence in the water. Students begin to go underwater and float, glide, kick, and swim with little to no assistance in this class. For ages, 3-4.
Preschool 3:	Students will float, glide, kick and swim with no assistance. Students will perform skills for longer durations/greater

LEVEL PROGRAMS-AGES, 5 AND UP

- Level 1: Students will work on increasing comfort in the water. Class objectives include full underwater bobs along and floating in the front and back with little to no assistance. For ages, 5-10.
- Level 2: For those who are ready to learn the foundations of front and back swimming. Students must be able to float with little or no assistance before enrolling. Previous swim lesson experience highly recommended. Ages, 5-10.
- Level 3: Students will learn correct technique for front crawl/elementary backstroke and will be introduced to dolphin kick, scissors kick and treading water. Must pass Level 2 or be able to swim 10 yards unassisted on the front and back before enrolling. Ages, 5-12.
- Level 4: Students will increase endurance for front crawl/elementary backstroke. Participants will learn the backcrawl, sidestroke, breaststroke and butterfly. Class is held in deep water; must pass Level 3 before enrolling. Ages, 6-14.
- Level 5: Students will work on coordination and refinement of strokes to increase endurance and efficiency while swimming. Flip turns will be introduced. Students must know all six strokes before enrolling. Ages, 7-14.
- Level 6: Students will continue with refinement of strokes in order to swim with more ease, efficiency, power and smoothness over greater distances. Fitness elements will be taught to students. Must be proficient in all six strokes before enrolling. Ages, 8-14.

TEEN PROGRAM-AGES, 10-15

Beginner Teen:	This class is for students that have minimal swimming experience. Students will learn how to float, glide, kick
	and swim on the front and back. This class is for students who cannot do skills independently. Ages, 10-15.
Intermediate Teen:	This class is for students who can already float, glide, kick and swim on the front and back. Students will be
	taught proper form and technique for swimming front and backcrawl. Rhythmic breathing, elementary
	backstroke, and breaststroke will be introduced. Ages, 10-15.
Advanced Teen:	This class is for students that can proficiently swim the front and back crawl, elementary backstroke and
	breaststroke. Sidestroke and butterfly will be introduced. Students will begin to learn advanced techniques
	such as turns, and will begin distance/endurance swimming. Ages,10-15.

ADULT PROGRAM-AGES, 16 AND UP

Beginner Adult:	For those that have never swam before and have a fear of the water. Class focuses on becoming comfortable in and around the water. Skills will include going underwater, floating, gliding, kicking and swimming with the
	assistance of a floatation device and/or instructor if necessary.
Intermediate Adult:	For those that have completed the Beginner class or are comfortable in the water. Students should be able
	to swim independently before enrolling. Class focuses on various strokes such as the front crawl, back
	crawl, breaststroke, elementary backstroke, sidestroke and butterfly. Correct form/technique will be taught.
Advanced Adults:	For those who are strong swimmers and want to get a swim team type workout. This class will include proper
	stretches, warm-ups, workouts and cool downs.

GROUP SWIM LESSONS

Classes are once per week, 30 minutes. No make-ups or refunds due to missed classes. If the pool is closed due to maintenance issues or inclement weather, a make-up class will be scheduled at the end of the session. No refunds after the first class. Refunds will only be processed by the Aquatic Supervisor or Swim Lesson Coordinator. Facility usage is NOT included in swim lesson fees. Please refer to the class descriptions to determine the appropriate placement of your student. It is highly encouraged if unsure of student placement to attend the free testing day.


