**Gardening Products:** pesticides, weed killers, poisons, sprays & dusts, fertilizers

**Household Products:** oven cleaner, vegetable oil, muriatic acid, rat/ant poison, drain cleaner, pool or photo chemicals, oil based paint and paint supplies, nail polish & remover, aerosol cans, Styrofoam, products containing mercury, florescent tubes and medications

## **NASA STEAM Kits Available at the Civic Center Library**

The Civic Center Library now offers binoculars that Warren Public Library cardholders can check out for stargazing or bird watching. The Library Binoculars program, a new phase of the Library Telescope Program, has been launched in partnership with the Warren Astronomical Club and is sponsored by a grant from NASA@ My Library. The binoculars kit, which includes one pair of Vortex Crossfire binoculars, guides to the night sky and backyard birds of Michigan, and a 60-inch tripod with a tripod adapter, is available to checkout for one week.

There are also two types of telescopes available for check-out. There is a large telescope at all four library branches and two smaller FunScopes at the Civic Center Library designed for children that can be checked out in a STEAM kit. In addition, the Warren Public Library is continuing to provide free educational programs that include telescope viewing events and local speakers from the Warren Astronomical Society.
