Don't Wait Any Longer Home Repair Loans Available

The City of Warren's Residential Rehabilitation Program is accepting applications from income-eligible households for low or no interest loans. The loans are used to bring the home up to code and make repairs to owner-occupied single-family residences. The maximum loan amount is \$30,000. To qualify for the Program, applicants must **own** and **occupy** the home, have homeowner's insurance, have a history of making house and property tax payments (including the water bill) on time, and have a household income that is below the limits established by The Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD):

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE NEWS

Ordinance Sec. 34-3 – Placing leaves, grass, etc., on public ways or private property.

No person shall cause to be placed or burned any grass clippings, leaves, lawn rakings, tree or bush trimmings, tree trunks, stumps, ashes, soil, dirt or household debris in or on any street, alley or public way in the city. (a)

No person shall cause to be placed any grass clippings, leaves, law rakings, tree or bush trimmings, tree trucks, stumps, ashes, soil, dirt or household debris in or on any parcel of land not belonging to the depositor. This section shall not be construed to permit depositing on one's own property if said depositing is prohibited by any other ordinance or statute. (b)
