CALL TO ORDER: Commissioner Middleswart called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm.

<u>PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:</u> Commissioner Ahmed led the attendees in the Pledge of the Allegiance.

<u>APPROVAL OF THE SPECIAL MEETING AGENDA / MINUTES:</u> A motion by Commissioner Riley, seconded by Commissioner Kobir to approve the Special Meeting Agenda and the Special Meeting Minutes. The motion passed unanimously.

<u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</u>: A motion by Commissioner Marshall, seconded by Commissioner Riley to approve the Minutes with discussion by Commissioner Middleswart. Commissioner Riley would like to add under "New Business" Purchase Fire Place Heater. Commissioner Marshall would like to add under New Business "Warming Boxes Distributed". Assistant Secretary Martin would like to add under New Business "X-Mas Breakfast". The motion passed unanimously.

PUBLIC MEETING: None.

<u>CORRESPONDENCE:</u> Commissioner Middleswart received notice that the receipt for the candy that Commissioner Marshall had purchased for the Harvest Treat was kicked back. Them has spoken to Ms. Battle and has emailed Ms. Mika to see how this can be resolved. Assistant City Attorney Murphy stated that she will look into it.

Commissioner Middleswart read a written complaint from a guest whom attended last month's meeting. From our discussion it was outlined that we need to choose our words more carefully and to be sensitive to people's situations.

Crime Commission Appreciation Dinner:
