Dear Council Secretary Moore:

Attached please find the above-noted resolution to approve a second lease with METCO Services, Inc. for an additional five-year period for an approximate 4,860 square feet of office space at the former Water and Engineering Building at 12821 Stephens, Warren, MI.

The initial lease with METCO dated January 27, 2014 provided for a five-year term, with an option to renew for an additional five years. The lease was renewed for another five years effective January 3, 2019, and is scheduled to expire on January 2, 2024. The Mayor, Public Service Director and Water Superintendent are recommending a new lease with METCO, to provide ongoing occupancy and upkeep for a vacant City building, and to keep a local presence for METCO, which provides engineering services, as-needed under a separate contract.

Water Superintendent Tom Pawelkowski negotiated a rental increase from \$13.50 to \$14.50 a square foot. Based upon the 4,860 square ft. area, the annual rental payment is \$70,470.00. METCO will pay personal and real taxes during occupancy. The City's other common lease provisions apply; no use, growth, cultivation or distribution of marihuana.

Consistent with our current lease, METCO is responsible for janitorial services, security and phone, internet and cable wiring and fees. The City would be responsible for reasonable utilities, snow removal and salting. The agreement also authorizes the Public Service Director to grant consent to internet providers requiring access to service METCO.

The City owns an administrative office building at 12821 Stephens Rd., formerly used for engineering and water administrative services (Building).

The City entered into an agreement dated January 27, 2014, as amended by Addenda No. 1 and No. 2, to lease office space on the second floor of the Building to METCO Services, Inc. ("METCO"), an engineering consultant firm. The total current lease area is 4,860 square feet.

METCO made renovations to the Building in accordance it lease obligations, and continues to provide the City with engineering services, on an as-needed basis under a separate contract.

On January 2, 2024, the lease is scheduled to expire.

The Mayor and Water Superintendent are recommending a new lease with METCO to provide the building with ongoing occupancy, maintenance and upkeep, to supplement the Water Division revenues, and to retain a local presence for METCO, to benefit the City's engineering service needs.

The Water Superintendent negotiated a rent increase from \$13.50 to \$14.50 per square foot, equating to an annual rental payment of \$70,470.00. METCO will also pay real and personal property taxes on the property.

THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Clerk are authorized to execute a Second Lease for Office Space at 12821 Stephens, with METCO Services, Inc. for a five year

# Amendment to Renew Lease for Offices at 12821 Stephens, Warren, Michigan

# **RECITALS**

- 1. The City is the owner of an office building at 12821 Stephens, Warren Michigan, which is legally described in exhibit A ("the Building"). Since January 27, 2014, the City and Tenant were parties to a Lease, entitled, "Agreement to Lease Office Spaces at 12821 Stephens" dated January 27, 2014 ("Lease").
  - 2. Under the terms of the Lease, Tenant made certain renovations to rehabilitate the vacant Building. Following renewals and amendments Tenant occupies 4,860 square feet of office space within the Building (Lease Area).
  - On January 26, 2019, the Lease was renewed for a five year term with a five year renewal, effective January 3, 2024. The lease is scheduled to expire on January 2, 2024, with no further renewal terms remaining.
  - 4. The parties wish to enter into a new lease, to ensure ongoing occupancy and upkeep for a vacant City building, continue a local presence for METCO, and to help defray Water Division costs.

THEREFORE, in consideration for the mutual promises of the parties, as contained in this document, the parties agree as follows:

- Lease. The City agrees to lease to Tenant, and Tenant agrees to lease from the City, for the terms and subject to the terms and provisions of this Lease, office space consisting of 4,860 feet located on the second floor of the vacant City office building located at 12821 Stephens, Warren, Michigan (Building). The Building is depicted on Exhibit A, and the lease area of 4,860 feet of the Building ("Lease Area"), is depicted on the attached sketch of the lease area, incorporated by reference into this Addendum as Exhibit B. The Lease Area, Building, surrounding parking lot, ingress and egress areas, and other common areas and the real property upon which the Building is situated is referred to as the "Property".
- 2. Term. The term of the Lease shall be for a period of five (5) years following the date this Lease is executed ("Commencement Date").
- Renewal. This lease may be renewed for additional period of up to five years upon the mutual consent of the parties, and provided Tenant gives Lessor written notice of the intent to renew not less than ninety (90) in advance of the expiration of the first term. Lessor will provide Tenant with a response within 30 days of Tenant's notice of intent to renew. The parties understand that renewal is subject to their mutual agreement to rent for the renewal term and approval of the Warren City Council. Prior to renewal term, the parties will review the rent and establish annual increases for the remainder of the term, which shall be based upon market value as determined by the Warren City Assessor, if the Lease is renewed.
- 4. Rent. Effective upon January 1, 2024, the annual rental payment for the total Lease Area is adjusted to \$70,470.00, based upon the base rate of \$14.50 per square foot. The rent may be paid in monthly installments of \$5,872.50. The parties acknowledge all credit to prior rent paid under the Lease has been satisfied for Tenant's Pre-Occupancy Improvements Expanded Area, as provided in the initial lease and the amendments.
  - 4.1. Additional Rent. In addition to the Rent as provided above, Tenant will pay as Additional Rent, its prorated portion of water, gas, electrical utilities charges for its use of the Building, which is agreed to as \$100 a month. In the event, the utility usage for the Lease Area exceeds \$100 a month, the Tenant agrees that Landlord may charge for actual usage based upon the prorated portion of the

Building utility charge, or Tenant and Landlord may agree to a flat rate of Additional Rent to account for such higher proportion of usage.

- 4.2 Payment Date. The first Rent payment and Additional Rent payment shall be due and payable to the City of Warren on January 1, 2024, and on the 1st day of each month thereafter. The payment will be paid at the address of Lessor as provided in section \_\_\_\_ of this Agreement, without any prior demand or without any deductions or setoff whatsoever.
- 5. Use. Tenant agrees that the Lease Area will only be used strictly for general administrative office purposes, and will not be used for other purposes without the consent of the City. The Lease Area or Property shall not be used for the growth, distribution, cultivation or processing of medical marihuana, or for any sexually-oriented business or for any other use or purpose that would require a special land use permit under Section 14.02 of the Code of Zoning Ordinances of the City of Warren, or for any manufacturing or industrial uses as defined in the Code of Zoning Ordinances. Activities conducted on the Property must comply with all laws, ordinances and regulations of the City of Warren, State of Michigan and Federal Government.
- 6. Taxes. Tenant shall pay when due its personal property taxes and real property taxes for the Lease Area, as expanded, and any area of its occupancy upon the Property.
- 7. The Lessee will also have the right, with Lessor and other lessees and guests and patrons of Lessor, to reasonable usage of the common areas of the Building. The Building and surrounding parking lot or curtilage and field are collectively referred to as "the Property", provided, however it is understood that use of the common areas of the Property are subject to the terms of this Lease. Lessor's contact and representative with oversight of the administration of this Lease is the Superintendent of Water Division. The Director may impose reasonable rules and regulations governing the use and occupancy of the Lease Area and Property, upon reasonable advance notice to Tenant.
  - 8. Renovations and Maintenance; Condition of Premises.
- 8.1 Improvements. Other Renovations. During the course of the Lease, Tenant may not make structural alterations without the advance written notice of and pursuant to terms of the Director of Public Service. Such improvements must be removed at the expiration of the lease, unless otherwise directed by the Director of Public Service. It is understood that Tenant's Pre-Occupancy improvements will remain on the Property upon termination.
  - 8.2 Tenant's Maintenance Responsibilities. Tenant shall, at its own cost and expense, maintain in good condition and repair the interior and exterior of the Building, including but not limited to the cleaning windows, replacing glass or windows or other property damaged or broken by Tenant or its contractors or invitees, any finish work, floors and floor covering, smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors and battery replacement on such detectors, security systems, plumbing maintenance, such as clogs, light bulb replacement, trash removal to common area receptacles, , janitorial services, and its own phones, internet service fees, lines and hardware. Lessor will pay for reasonable usage of utilities, and be responsible for HVAC, snow removal, and parking lot salting, paving and striping. Tenant will be responsible for maintenance, repair or replacement of the pre-occupancy work or renovations it performed pursuant to the Lease and Addendum No. 1 dated July 3, 2014, copies and familiarity of which the parties acknowledge.
- 8.3 Landlord's Responsibilities. Landlord will be responsible for snow plowing, parking lot striping and maintenance, landscaping, trash removal from dumpsters, repair of any plumbing, heating, air conditioner, and roof. Notwithstanding the above, It is understood that Landlord will not be responsible for damages, loss or destruction to any part of the Property caused by Tenant, or its contractors, agents or employees, and Tenant may be charges for excessive utility usage caused by Tenant, or Tenant's contractors, agents, or employees, exceeding the amount of Additional Rent.

- 8.4 Lessor and Lessee's Responsibilities. Lessor will be responsible for maintaining the Property and the lighting, doors, windows and walls of the Lease Area, except for damage caused by the negligence of Lessee, or its employees, guests or invitees, the building structure, parking lot and all common areas, doors, take all trash and garbage to common area hall receptacle provided by Lessor, and arrange for pick-up by Lessor. Lessee will be responsible for the repair or replacement of any property damaged by Lessee, or its employees, contractors or guests. Lessee is responsible for the repair or replacement of broken or damaged property of Lessor or of third parties caused by Lessee, its agents, employees or invitees. The failure to repair or replace damaged property of Lessor or of a third party, after 30 days' notice, will be added as Additional Rent, and must be paid the following rental period.
- 8.5 Lessor reserves the right to make any structural repairs or alterations to the Property or Lease Area, including to any wall, floor, trade fixture, lighting, and will coordinate such work with Lessee to make every effort to not disturb Lessee's use of the Lease Area.
- 8.6 Contractor's Insurance. Prior to any work performed by a contractor, Tenant's contractors and subcontractors shall obtain and keep in effect the insurance coverage in the types and limits set forth in this lease. Tenant shall submit copies of any contractors' insurance certificates to Lessor.
- 8.7 Tenant is responsible for any for obtaining and complying with any business or trade permits necessary to conduct its operations on the Property, occupancy, or for renovations.
- 8.8 Tenant shall not use or occupy the Property in any manner that would violate any certificate of occupancy affecting the Building or which would consist of a public or private nuisance or waste.
- 8.9 Tenant shall under no conditions have the power or authority to subject, and is expressly prohibited, from subjecting the property to any lien, charge, or encumbrance whatsoever, and shall indemnify, defend and save harmless the City against all liens charges or encumbrances that may be asserted against the Property.
- 8.10 "As is" Condition of Premises. Tenant has inspected the commercial building, land, parking lot, soil, landscaping, parking lot and any other aspect or area of the Property, and understands that the Premises and common areas are leased in "as is" condition". Tenant accepts the Leased Premises in an "as is" condition without any representations by Lessor as to the condition. Tenant acknowledges that the Lessor is not obligated to make any of the improvements to the Premises as a condition precedent to the Tenant's use and occupancy of the Premises and Tenant's obligation to pay rent.
- 8.11 Operation of Business. Tenant shall promptly comply with all laws and ordinances and lawful orders and regulations affecting the Premises, and the cleanliness, safety, occupancy and use of same.
- 8.12 Tenant shall not use or permit the use of any portion of the Premises for any unlawful or offensive purposes or conduct. No trucks may be stored on the Property, and no trucks or loud equipment may be operated in violation of local ordinances.
- 8.13 Care of Premises. Tenant shall keep the Leased Premises orderly, neat, safe and clean and shall store all trash and garbage within the Leased Premises, and arrange for the regular pickup of such trash and garbage. Tenant will comply with and observe all rules and regulations reasonably established by Lessor from time to time. Lessor will provide Tenant with advance written notice of applicable rules and regulations. In the event Lessee fails to keep the Property in the condition called for above, Lessor may enter upon the Property and have all rubbish, dirt, trash and garbage removed or otherwise cleaned, and may seek reimbursement from Lessee for its costs, which will be due within 15 days of notice from Lessor and evidence of payment. Lessee will be responsible for the repair or replacement of any property owned or belonging to Lessor or a third party that is damaged or destroyed by Lessee, or its employees, contractors, guests or invitees.

- 9. Signs. Tenant may, at its expense, install signs at the Leased Premises, with the prior written approval of Lessor. All plans and specifications, and proposed location and wording, shall be submitted to Lessor for its prior approval of the same. Any such signs must be compatible with the location, size, color and character of the other signs in the Project and satisfy all local codes and ordinances and must be kept in good repair. In the event Lessor imposes rules and regulations or renovations requiring modification of Tenant's signs, Tenant shall, if required by Lessor, conform to the new criteria. No signs or advertising materials will be permitted on the roof. Signs in the window, pedestrian walkways, parking lot or common areas are not allowed, except with the advance written permission of Lessor. All signs shall be erected and maintained in compliance with local codes and ordinances.
- 10. Utilities. Landlord will be responsible for pre-payment of water and sewer, electricity, and gas delivered to the Premises on presentation of the invoice from the utility companies so that no past due accounts arise, provided however, Tenant will pay for its portion as Additional Rent as provided in this Agreement. Tenant is solely responsible for direct payment to the utility companies for phone, cable and internet service charges.
- 10.1 Interruption. Lessor shall not be responsible or liable for any interruption of utility services nor shall such interruption constitute grounds for any rent abatement or be deemed a disturbance of Tenant's use and possession of the Premises. Tenant agrees that it will not install any equipment which will exceed or overload the capacity of any utility facilities serving the Premises and that if any equipment installed by Tenant shall require additional utility facilities, the same shall be installed at Tenant's expense in accordance with the plans and specifications to be approved in writing by Lessor. Any interruption of utility service that is caused by the sole gross negligence of Lessor and which results in the temporary loss or substantial degradation of Tenant's use and occupancy of the Premises may be grounds for rent abatement prorated for the period of non-service. Such rent abatement shall be Tenant's sole remedy for damages arising from such interruption of utility service, and Lessor is not responsible for any loss of business or any other damages resulting from the interruption of utilities.
- 11. Alterations and Improvements. The Tenant shall not make or cause to be made any alterations, additions or improvements to the Leased Premises, except with the prior written approval of the Director of Public Service. Tenant shall submit to Lessor plans and specifications for such work. The work shall be performed in compliance with the requirements below:
- Tenant shall obtain, at its expense any permits or licenses necessary to perform such work. All work shall comply with and be performed in accordance with applicable codes, laws, ordinances, and regulations.
- Work shall be performed by licensed contractors, and shall be performed in a professional and workmanlike manner. All materials shall be new and high quality.
- Tenant shall provide Lessor with the name and address of Tenant's general, mechanical and electrical contractors, prior the commencement of work. Tenant and Tenant's contractors shall obtain and keep in effect all insurance in the types and amounts and conditions as noted in this Agreement.
- Tenant shall ensure that necessary precautions are taken to protect the safety of persons and property, and to protect the Common Areas, Property, and other tenants and their units on the Property. Tenant agrees to repair or replace any such damage or loss.
  - Maintenance and Surrounding Area.
- 12.1 Tenant's Responsibilities. Tenant shall be responsible for the repair or replacement of any broken or damaged windows and for any expenses incurred in connection with any breakage, stoppage or damage caused by Tenant, its agents, employees, invitees, licensees or contractors.
- 12.2 In addition to the occupancy requirements noted elsewhere in this Lease, Tenant comply with the following:
- 1. Tenant will maintain the neatness and condition of the adjacent areas. Tenant shall regularly sweep and pick up litter and debris in the area and during the winter months shall keep its

walkways clear of snow and ice for pedestrians. Tenant will be responsible for any rock salt to the entrance pathways.

- 2. Tenant, at its own expense, shall maintain or replace fire extinguishers, smoke alarms, and other fire protection devices as may be required by law, code or regulation or by the insurance underwriters insuring the Leased Premises. Lessor assumes no responsibility for the maintenance and operation of fire extinguishers, carbon monoxide detectors, smoke alarms and other protection devises, regardless of whether or Lessor initially furnishes the Premises with such devices. It is Tenant's responsibility to ensure such devices are functioning properly, to install or replace batteries, and to purchase and install additional or replacement devices.
- 3. Tenant will keep the Premises at a temperature sufficiently high to prevent freezing of water in any pipes and fixtures.
- 4. Tenant will not operate any music system or conduct activities that that disturb the adjoining neighbors.
  - 5. Tenant will not receive or ship articles of any kind after 8 p.m. or before 7 a.m.
- 6. Tenant will not conduct its meetings in the outdoor areas, except with the permission of the Lessor.
  - 7. Tenant is responsible for its own security, including security against privacy breaches, criminal acts or fraud perpetrated against Tenant, or its officer, employees, invitees, guests or agents, on the Property, including the common areas.
  - 8. Tenant or its contractors will not discharge any contaminant or hazardous substance or any processing water, waste or material other than sanitary waste into existing drains, and any problems with drains to the extent caused by such Tenant by Tenant are to be corrected by Tenant at Tenant's expense.
  - 9. Tenant shall not engage in or conduct any activity or operation at the Property, which involves the release, use handling operation, treatment storage or disposal of any Hazardous Substance, except with advance notice and permission of the Public Service Director.
  - 10. Tenant agrees to keep the Leased Premises, Property or any other property or interest of Lessor free from any liens arising out of work performed, materials furnished or other obligations incurred by or for Tenant, or Tenant's officers, employees, agents, or contractors. Tenant agrees to bond against or discharge any lien within ten (10) days after written request from Lessor, in accordance with Paragraph 11. Tenant shall reimburse Lessor for any costs or expenses which may be incurred by Lessor by reason of the filing of such lien and/or the removal of the same, within seven (7) days of a statement from Lessor setting forth the amount of such costs and expenses. The failure to either discharge the lien and/or to reimburse Lessor its costs relating to such lien will constitute a breach of this Agreement.
- Lessor's Right of Entry. Lessor shall have full right to entry to the Premises for purposes of making inspections, recommendations and/or repairs as provided in this Paragraph or elsewhere in this Agreement, or to fulfill any other purpose as authorized or required under this Agreement. Lessor will make reasonable efforts to perform its repairs or improvements at reasonable times and without substantial intrusion to Tenant's business operations, whenever feasible. Lessor will otherwise make arrangements in advance with Tenant prior to performing improvements or repairs that will substantially interfere with Tenant's business operations. Lessor shall not be responsible for any interruption to Tenant during the completion of its repairs of improvements. If Tenant fails to perform any repair any damage or maintenance required of Tenant under this Lease, Lessor may enter the Premises to perform the work, and the cost of such work must be paid by Tenant within 30 days of notice.

- 14. Insurance and Indemnity.
- 14.1. Tenant's Insurance Obligations. During the term of this Lease, and prior to performing any work, Tenant, and any of Tenant's contractors when applicable, shall, at their expense procure and keep in effect, the following types and limits of insurance:
  - a. Workers Compensation Insurance for employees which meets Michigan's statutory limits.
- b. Comprehensive Motor Vehicle Liability Insurance covering all owned, nonowned, or hired automobiles or trucks with minimum limits of \$1,000,000 combined single limit bodily injury and/or property damage for each accident. Such insurance shall comply with the provisions of the Michigan No Fault Insurance Law and shall provide coverage for Personal Protection Insurance, Property Protection Insurance, and Residual Liability Insurance;
- c. Commercial General Liability Insurance with a \$1,000,000 limit for each occurrence for bodily injury and property damage liability and a \$2,000,000 aggregate combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage liability. The policy shall include the following extensions:
  - i. Blanket contractual liability clause for all written contracts;
  - ii. Produce and Completed Operations;
  - iii. Independent Contractor's Coverage;
  - iv. Broad Form General Liability Extensions or equivalent;
  - d. Umbrella Liability Policy with a \$2,000,000 limit;
- e. Owners and Contractors Protective Liability Insurance, naming the Lessor and Tenant, and with policy limits no less than those required for Commercial General Liability Insurance, as set forth above.
- e. Tenant's Builder's Risk Insurance. Tenant shall provide a complete Value Form "All physical Loss" Builder's Risk coverage on its work in the Premises as it related to the building within which the Premises is located.
- f. Property Insurance. Tenant agrees to include in its coverage, at its expense, insurance against fire, vandalism, malicious mischief, and such other perils as are from time to time included in a standard extended coverage endorsement, insuring Tenant's merchandise, trade fixtures, furnishings, equipment and all other items of personal property of Tenant located on or within the Leased Premises, in an amount equal to not less than one hundred percent (100%) of the actual replacement cost.
- g. Tenant shall not carry any stock of goods or do anything in or about said Leased Premises which will in any way tend to increase the insurance rates on the Premises. If Tenant installs any electrical equipment that overloads the lines in the Leased Premises, Tenant shall, at its own expense, make whatever changes are necessary to comply with the requirements of the insurance underwriters and governmental authorities having jurisdiction.
- 14.2 Additional Insured. The certificates of insurance shall name as an additional insured, the City of Warren, City of Warren Downtown Development Authority, the 37th District Court, and their elected or appointed officers, employees, boards, commissions and volunteers as individuals acting within the scope of their authority.
- 14.3 Tenant shall provide the Lessor with certificates of all insurance required in this Lease evidencing such coverage at the time of the execution of this Lease. All policies other than for Worker's Compensation shall be written on an occurrence and not on a claim made basis.
- 14.4 Contractor and subcontractors shall be subject to the same insurance requirements, unless waived in writing by Lessor as to types and limits not applicable to the project.

- 14.5 The insurance required under this Agreement may be revised upward, if good cause exists to support such revision. Tenant shall so revise the amounts within sixty (60) days following notice to Tenant.
- 14.6 All policies shall be endorsed to provide that the insurer shall give written notice to the Lessor at least thirty (30) days in advance of any cancellation or expiration of the policy. Tenant shall provide the Lessor with written notice of any material change to any policy immediately upon receipt of notice of such material change. Tenant shall provide the Lessor with copies of policies required by this Lease. In the event that this Lease is extended beyond its original term, the Lessor and Tenant shall agree upon required insurance coverage to be in effect during any extended term of this Lease.
- 14.7. Lessor's Insurance. Lessor also agrees, to carry (i) insurance against fire, vandalism, malicious mischief and such other perils as are from time to time included in a standard extended coverage endorsement and, at Lessor's option, special extended coverage endorsements, insuring the Leased Premises and all improvements thereto in an amount determined solely by Lessor, but not less than one hundred percent (100%) of the full replacement cost, available.

15. Indemnity.

- Tenant agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless, Lessor, the City of Warren Downtown Development Authority, City of Warren Municipal Building Authority, and their officers, agents, employees, members, boards and commissions from any claim, action, suit, liability, cost or expense (including reasonable attorney fees for any property loss or damage, and/or personal injury and/or death) arising out of or related to the use, occupancy, or maintenance or the Lease Area or Property, and any negligent act or omission of Tenant, or Tenant's officers, agents, employees, contractors, subcontractors, licensees or invitees. It is understood that Tenant will not be obligated for liability caused by the gross negligence of Lessor, or its officers, employees or agents, or any other unrelated third party. Tenant will be responsible for any fine, penalty that may be imposed by any governmental authority attributed to an act or omission of Tenant, or one of its contractors or invitees.
- b For the purpose hereof, the Lease Area shall include the Property, common areas, service areas, sidewalks, the parking lot and all improvements thereon, other areas adjoining the same and the loading platform area allocated to the use of Tenant. In case Lessor shall, without fault on its part, be made a party to any litigation commenced by or against Lessee, then Lessee shall protect and hold it harmless and shall pay all costs, expenses and reasonable attorneys' fees incurred or paid by Lessor in connection with such litigation.
- Lessee also agrees that Lessee and not Lessor is responsible for its own security and the safety and security of its employees, invitees, and agents, in and on the Property, including the Lease Area, walkways, common areas, parking lot and building. Tenant holds harmless and indemnifies Lessor harmless from and for any damage or injury that may be caused by any third party, criminal act of a third party, or any act or omission of a third party occupant or lessee of the Property, including acts that occur in the Lease Area, parking lot, walkways and common areas. In case Lessor is, without fault on its part, made a party to any litigation commenced by or against Lessee, then Lessee shall protect and hold it harmless and shall pay all costs, expenses and reasonable attorneys' fees incurred or paid by Lessor in connection with such litigation.
- d The indemnification requirements in this Agreement shall survive termination or expiration of this Agreement for acts or occurrences during Tenant's use or occupancy.

#### Tenant's Property.

Tenant's Liability. All Tenant's personal property, including trade fixtures, on the Premises shall be kept at Tenant's sole risk. Lessor shall not be responsible or liable to Tenant for any loss of business or other loss or damage that may be occasioned by or through the acts or omissions of persons occupying adjoining premises or any part of the premises adjacent to or connected with the leased Premises or any part of the Building of which the leased Premises are a part or for any loss or damage resulting to Tenant or its business or property from water, gas, sewer, or steam pipes that burst, overflow, stop, or leak; from heating, cooling, or plumbing fixtures; or from electric wires or gas odors within the leased Premises from

any cause, except as may result from and be directly caused by the gross negligence or recklessness of Lessor. The provisions of this section shall not be interpreted to prevent Tenant from recovering any losses under the coverage provided by Lessor's fire and extended coverage insurance policy, if any losses of Tenant are covered by that policy.

Destruction of Premises. If the Premises are partially damaged or destroyed through no fault of Tenant, Lessor shall, at its own expense, promptly repair and restore the Premises. Rent shall abate in whole or in part during the period of restoration according to the amount of destruction, if the destruction was not caused by Tenant. If the Premises are totally destroyed through no fault of Tenant or if the Premises cannot be repaired and restored within one hundred and twenty (120) days after the event of destruction, either party shall have the right to terminate this Lease, effective as of the date of the event, by giving the other party written notice of termination within thirty (30) calendar days after the occurrence of the event. If the notice is given within that time period, this Lease shall terminate, and rent shall be adjusted between the parties to the date of the occurrence of the event. If the notice is not given within the required period, this Lease shall continue and Lessor shall repair the Premises.

Notice by Tenant. Tenant shall give immediate notice to Lessor in case of fire or accidents in the Leased Premises or in the building of which the premises are a part, or of defects in any fixtures or equipment that must be repaired by Lessor.

Mutual Releases. Lessor and Tenant, and all parties claiming under them, mutually release and discharge each other from all claims and liabilities arising from or caused by any hazards covered by insurance on the leased Premises or covered by insurance in connection with property on or activities conducted on the Premises regardless of the cause of the damage or loss. Lessor and Tenant shall each cause appropriate clauses to be included in their respective insurance policies covering the Premises waiving subrogation against the other party consistent with the mutual release in this paragraph.

17. Lessee's Repairs.

Lessee shall be responsible for the repair or replacement of any broken or damaged windows or other property caused by Lessee, or its employees, patrons, invitees, licensees or contractors on the Property in connection with Lessee's use, occupancy or exercise of rights under this Lease. Lessee agrees to complete any required repairs, if any, in an expeditious and workmanlike manner. If Lessee refuses or neglects to commence or complete the repairs required by Lessee in this paragraph, promptly and adequately, Lessor may, but shall not be required, make all or any part of said repairs and Lessee shall pay the cost upon evidence by Lessor of payment made, non-payment of which shall entitle Lessor to exercise any remedy available to it in the event of the non-payment by Lessee of rental or any other charge due to Lessor under this Lease.

18. Lessee's Property/ Risk.

- 18.1. Lessee's Liability. All Lessee's personal property, including trade fixtures, on the Property shall be kept at Lessee's sole risk. Lessor shall not be responsible or liable to Lessee for any loss of business or other loss or damage that may be occasioned by or through the acts or omissions of persons occupying adjoining premises or any part of the premises adjacent to or connected with the Lease Area or any part of the building of which the Lease Area are a part or for any loss or damage resulting to Lessee or its business or property from water, gas, sewer, or steam pipes that burst, overflow, stop, or leak; from heating, cooling, or plumbing fixtures; or from electric wires or gas odors within the Lease Area from any cause, except as may result from and be directly caused by the gross negligence or recklessness of Lessor. The provisions of this section shall not be interpreted to prevent Lessee from recovering any losses under the coverage provided by Lessor's fire and extended coverage insurance policy, if any losses of Lessee are covered by that policy.
- 18.2. Notice by Lessee. Lessee shall give immediate notice to Lessor in case of fire or accidents in the Lease Area or in the building of which the Lease Area is a part or of defects in any fixtures or equipment.
- 18.3. Subrogation. Lessee, and all parties claiming under Lessee releases and discharge each other from all claims and liabilities arising from or caused by any hazards covered by insurance on the Property and Lease Area or covered by insurance in connection with property on or activities conducted on the Property regardless of the cause of the damage or loss. Lessee shall cause appropriate clauses to

be included in its insurance policies covering the Lease Area waiving subrogation against Lessor and additional insured parties.

#### Termination and Default.

Surrender of Premises. Tenant shall surrender the Premises to Lessor at the expiration or termination of this Lease broom clean and restored to the condition as at the Commencement Date, except for normal wear and tear, or walls, carpentry, carpeting, and electrical wiring and other work installed and approved as a pre-occupancy improvement under the Lease, or otherwise required to remain by the Director of Public Service, which will become the property of and belong to Lessor.

Property Removal. Except as provided above, all other personal property and moveable equipment installed by Tenant in connection with the business conducted by it on the Premises shall remain the property of Tenant and shall be removed by it at the expiration of this Lease. Tenant shall repair any damage caused by such removal. Any fixtures or improvements installed by Tenant shall otherwise remain on the Property and become the property of Lessor, unless otherwise directed by Lessor.

Default and Reentry. If Tenant neglects or fails to perform its obligation to pay rent or other charges when due; or fails to perform any other covenants in this Lease to be observed and performed on its part, for ten (10) days after written notice by Lessor of the default or; if Tenant makes any assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed for Tenant; or if any proceedings are instituted by or against Tenant in bankruptcy (including reorganization) or under any insolvency laws, Lessor may reenter the Premises and may remove all persons and property and may seek to relet the Premises on any terms that Lessor, in its sole discretion, deems advisable. Lessor shall have the right, but is not required, to declare this Lease terminated prior to such action. Notwithstanding any termination of the Lease by Lessor or reentry by Lessor without a termination, Tenant shall continue to be liable to Lessor for rent owed under this Lease, any rent deficiency that results from a reletting of the Premises during the term of this Lease, and the cost of reletting the Premises.

Notwithstanding any reletting without termination, Lessor may at any time elect to terminate this Lease for any default by Tenant by giving written notice of the termination to Tenant.

Other Remedies. In addition to Lessor's other rights and remedies as set forth in this Lease and without waiving any of those rights, if Lessor deems any repairs necessary that Tenant is required to make or if Tenant is in default in the performance of any of its obligations under this Lease, Lessor may, on failure of Tenant to meet the obligation, make or cause repairs to be made and defaults to be cured and shall not be responsible to Tenant for any loss or damage that occurs by reason of that action, and Tenant agrees that it will immediately on demand pay Lessor's reasonable costs for curing as additional rent under this Lease.

Non-Waiver of Remedies. In addition, Lessor reserves the right to pursue any other legal or equitable remedy, as available, and the pursuit of any remedy provided in this Agreement shall not waive Lessor's rights to pursue other remedies available by law or equity, provided, however, the Lessor shall not be entitle to duplicative monetary recovery.

During six months prior to the expiration of the Lease or any renewal, Lessor may place on the premises standard "for lease" or "for rent" signs. Tenant shall allow prospective tenants to inspect the Premises during that Period.

This lease shall terminate, and Lessee shall vacate the premises, upon expiration of the initial term, or if renewed, upon expiration of the renewal term.

Holding Over. It is agreed that in the event of Lessee holding over after the expiration or earlier termination of this Lease, the tenancy shall be from month to month in the absence of a written Lease to the contrary, and Lessee shall pay to Lessor rent equal to one hundred twenty-five (125%) percent of the then current monthly rental plus all other charges payable by Lessee under this lease prorated for each day from the expiration or termination of this Lease until the date the Lease Area is delivered to Lessor in

the condition required. All other terms and conditions of this Lease will remain in full force and effect during any holdover period.

- 20.2. Right of Entry and Inspection. Lessee shall permit Lessor or Lessor's agents to enter upon the Lease Area at reasonable times and on reasonable notice for purposes of inspection, showing the premises to prospective Lessees or purchasers, and to make such repairs, alterations, improvements or additions (work) to the Property. Lessor shall be allowed to take all materials into the Lease Area necessary for such work, without the same constituting a violation of the covenant of quiet enjoyment. The Rent shall in no way abate while such work is performed, due to any loss or interruption of business of the Lessee or otherwise, but Lessor shall perform all work in a timely manner and shall take all steps necessary to minimize any disruption to Lessees' business. Lessee understands when Lessee is not occupying the Lease Area, Lessor retains all rights to use and occupy the Lease Area. Lessee shall allow prospective Lessees to inspect the Lease Area during that time period but with minimal interruption.
- 20.3. Vacating and Abandonment. Upon expiration or termination of the Lease or if Lessee vacates the Lease Area, evidenced by removal of property and/or cessation of services for four consecutive Sundays, any personal property left in the Lease Area shall be deemed abandoned, and Lessor, at its option, may take possession of any personal property left by Lessor and charge Lessee a monthly fee for storage of that property, and any such fee will be deemed additional rent due with the remaining rent due. All Rent for the remainder of the Term will continue to be due monthly through the expiration of the Term.
- 20.4. Non-Exclusive; Right of First Refusal. Tenant understands that this Lease is exclusive as to the Lease Area, and non-exclusive as to the Building. Lessor may lease other areas of the Building to third parties. Prior to leasing any other office space in the Building, Lessor agrees to give Tenant the right of first refusal to lease the area that will be leased. Lessor will provide Tenant with 60 days advance notice, and Tenant must exercise its option within 30 days of such notice by executing a binding commitment to exercise that option.
- 21. Condemnation. If the Premises or any part of them are taken for any public or quasipublic purpose pursuant to any power of eminent domain, or by private sale in lieu of eminent domain, this Lease shall terminate effective as of the date the public authority takes possession. All damages for the condemnation of the Premises or Building that is awarded for the taking shall be payable to and be the sole property of Lessor.

Tenant shall pay rent and other applicable charges up to the day the authority takes possession, subject to a proportionate refund by Lessor for any amount paid in advance for the period subsequent to the taking.

22. Partial Condemnation. If only a portion of the Leased Premises shall be taken under eminent domain, then Lessor shall have the right to terminate this Lease, but is not required to terminate this Lease, and declare the same null and void by written notice of such intention to the Tenant within ten (10) days after such taking. In the event Lessor does not exercise said right of termination, all the terms of this Lease shall continue in effect, except that the fixed minimum annual rental shall be reduced in proportion to the amount of Leased Premises taken and Lessor or Lessee shall, at its own cost and expense, make all repairs or alterations to the Leased Premises as originally installed by Lessor, so as to constitute the remaining Leased Premises a complete architectural unit.

Lessor's and Tenant's Damages. All damages awarded for such taking under the power of eminent domain, whether for the whole or a part of the Leased Premises, shall belong to and be the property of Lessor whether such damages shall be awarded as compensation for diminution in value to the leasehold or to the fee of the premises; provided, however, that Lessor shall not be entitled to the award made for depreciation to, or the cost of removal of Tenant's stock and fixtures.

23. Assignment and Subletting. Tenant may not assign, sublet, or otherwise transfer or convey its interest, or portion of interest in this Lease and/or the Premises, without the prior written consent of the Lessor. Any sublet, assignment or transfer shall not relieve Tenant from its obligations

under this Lease. The sale, issuance, or transfer of any voting control of Tenant shall be deemed to be an assignment under this section.

24. Notices. Any notice, demand or other communication (Notice), required or permitted under this Agreement, shall be given in writing, signed by an authorized representative of the party, and, except as provided below in this section, shall be mailed by first-class mail, postage prepaid, or hand-delivered, and addressed to the addresses and recipient below, except that notice of an administrative nature, such as scheduling work or trash removal, may be made to e-mail addresses to contracts designated by each party.

Notices pertaining to a change of address or termination shall be given by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid.

Notices shall be deemed effective on the date personally delivered or, postmarked, if mailed.

#### 25. Miscellaneous

Reservation of Rights. It is agreed that the execution of this Lease shall not waive or surrender any of the Lessor's or the City of Warren's police powers as provided by law. All such governmental powers are reserved.

Accord and Satisfaction. No payment by Tenant or receipt by Lessor of a lesser amount than the monthly rent or other stipulated charges shall be deemed to be other than on account of the earliest stipulated rent, nor shall any endorsement or statement on any check or any accompanying letter be deemed an accord and satisfaction, and Lessor shall accept such check or payment without prejudice to Lessor's right to recover the balance of such rent or pursue any other remedy in this Lease provided.

Governing Laws. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Michigan. Any action in law or equity brought by either party shall be brought in a court of competent jurisdiction located in and whose jurisdiction includes the County of Macomb, State of Michigan.

Severability and Waiver. The provisions of this Agreement shall be deemed to be severable and the invalidity or unenforceability of any provision shall not affect the remainder of the Agreement. Any failure of either party to enforce a provision of this Agreement shall not be deemed to constitute a waiver of such provision. No waiver of any breach of the Agreement or of any term, right or condition, shall waive the right to enforce subsequent breaches of the Agreement or of any right, term or condition.

Entire Agreement. This Agreement encompasses the entire agreement and understanding between the parties, and this Agreement may not be amended or modified except by a written agreement executed by the parties to this Lease, and with the approval of the DDA.

Headings. The headings of this Agreement are for convenience only and shall not be used to construe, limit or interpret any of the terms of this Agreement.

Broker's Commission. Tenant represents and warrants that there are no claims for brokerage commissions or finder's fees in connection with this Agreement, and Tenant agrees to indemnify Lessor from any liabilities arising from such claim or alleged agreement. Such indemnity shall survive termination of this Lease.

Relationship of Parties. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed by any party as creating the relationship of principal and agent or of partnership or of joint venture between the parties. It is understood and agreed that no provision in this document nor any act of the parties shall be deemed to create any relationship between the parties other than that of Lessor and Tenant.

# COST SHARE AGREEMENT

This Agreement entered into this 14<sup>th</sup> day of December, 2023, by and between the Macomb County Department of Roads, hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY"; and the City of Warren, hereinafter referred to as "CITY".

WHEREAS, COUNTY and CITY initiated a project to rehabilitate 10 Mile Road from Ryan Road to Sherwood Avenue within the CITY, and

WHEREAS, COUNTY has adopted policies relating to CITY's participation in primary and local road projects, and

WHEREAS, COUNTY has agreed with CITY to have the project engineered, constructed, inspected and placed in service, and

NOW, THEREFORE, in order to save public funds and expedite the project, COUNTY and CITY agree to carry out the project under a single contract according to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The project termini are:
  - 10 Mile Road from Ryan Road to Sherwood Avenue
- 2. The total project shall be defined as, but not necessarily include:
  - Required material
  - Contract cost
  - Survey, engineering plans, testing and field staking
  - Labor and equipment rental charges
  - Overhead and fringe benefits
  - Right of way acquisition
  - Preliminary and construction engineering
  - Signing and pavement marking
  - Other labor, materials, etc. to provide a complete project
- 3. The following cost sharing proportions have been agreed to (Exhibit A):
  - CITY share: Fifty percent (50%) of all project costs
  - COUNTY share: Fifty percent (50%) of all project costs
- Funds provided by CITY shall be paid in full to COUNTY prior to the start of the project.

- 5. This agreement covers all related project costs incurred from inception through completion of project. COUNTY, at the request of CITY after completion of said project, will furnish CITY with a statement of actual costs of the project and will remit all collected monies exceeding the total cost of the project including overhead and fringe benefits or collect any additional monies necessary to meet the total cost of the project.
- Overhead and fringe benefits applied shall be at a rate as determined on an annual basis. This rate is subject to change annually based upon actual costs incurred from the prior year and shall be applied to those costs incurred for that particular period.
- CITY, COUNTY, the County of Macomb, their officers, agents, employees and consultants will be listed as additional insureds on the Contractor's insurance policy for general liability, automobile liability, excess coverage and worker's compensation.
- 8. COUNTY agrees to obtain authorization for additional expenditures beyond the limits of the Construction Contract from CITY prior to committal of same.

On Wednesday, October 25th, 2023 at 1:00 PM electronic bids were publicly opened for Bid ITB-W-1073; Fire Uniforms for a one (1) year period with the option to extend for two (2) additional one (1) year periods at the same terms and conditions, through mutual consent of both parties. This invitation was posted on the BidNet® (MITN) system. Three (3) vendors responded with bids. Their bids are summarized on the attached bid tabulation sheets submitted for your review.

In the past, the Fire Department had numerous problems with outfitting firefighters in a timely manner. In addition, on many occasions, the Fire Department personnel were not given the uniforms that were specified in the bid document. As a result, many of the City's fire personnel went without the necessary uniforms for long periods of time.

In an attempt to alleviate some of the problems, the Fire Department was approved by City Council to start following the procedures that the Police Department put in place, which gives the Police Department the authority to select from a list of multiple approved vendors when placing their uniform orders. This allows the Police Department to order uniforms on a per-

order basis, with the vendor that has the ability to deliver fire uniforms in the most timely and cost-effective manner.

This method has proven to be most beneficial to both the Police Department and the Fire Department in recent years. Thus, the recommendation before you today is to award a primary and a secondary vendor to provide uniforms to the Fire Department.

If approved by your honorable body, the Fire Department will utilize Allie Brothers, Inc. as its primary vendor. If, for any reason, Allie Brothers, Inc. cannot fill an order within a thirty (30) day time period, or is not capable of fulfilling the correct order, the Fire Department will have the ability to utilize NYE Uniform Company for the particular item(s).

The City's contract with the Firefighter's Union contains provides each firefighter with an annual uniform allowance, which will be used to purchase uniforms through this agreement. In addition, new hires will be outfitted with complimentary clothing when starting their employment with the City. By utilizing this agreement, the Fire Department staff will have a standard appearance throughout the department.

If approved, the agreement will commence on November 29, 2023 or upon the official date of City Council approval, whichever occurs later.

The Purchasing Division concurs with the Fire Department and recommends that City Council waive the bid process and award the purchase of Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA), to the sole source distributor, MacQueen Equipment, LLC, 1125 7th Street, E., Saint Paul, MN 55106, in the total amount of \$1,118,638.75.

The Fire Department's current inventory of SCBA's are eleven (11) years old. After the recent annual testing of the SCBA equipment this past summer, the certified testing company recommended that the entire inventory of SCBA's be replaced due to significant wear & tear on the department's harnesses and the numerous repairs that are continuously needed in order to maintain a sufficient number of serviceable SCBA's to meet the needs of the department.

If approved by your honorable body, the Fire Department will be purchasing the following:

- Eighty (80) complete sets of MSA G1 SCBA's, which include;
  - o Eighty (80) spare, 45-minute bottles
  - o One hundred and fifty (150) face pieces
  - o Eighty (80) Thermal Imaging Cameras (TIC)
  - o Eight (8) Sixty minute harnesses
  - o Sixteen (16) 60 minute bottles
  - o Eleven (11) Rapid Intervention Team (RIT) systems
  - o Testing equipment
  - o Training on SCBA's

Please see the attached department recommendation letters for additional information regarding this requested purchase.

With the testing equipment, the Fire Department will have the ability to perform annual testing and repair of SCBA systems, which will save the department approximately \$75,000.00 (\$7,500.00 per year) over the minimum ten (10) year life expectancy of the SCBA systems.

In addition, the City will be trading in its current obsolete SCBA's and spare bottles to obtain a credit of \$20,001.85. The credit has been applied to the total cost to achieve the final cost of \$1.118.638.75.

- 10. HUD system shall allow user to select from four modes of operation:
  - 1) Continuous pressure mode that shall always have pressure LEDs on.
  - Intermittent pressure mode that shall turn on first three increments when reached for 20 seconds.
  - Oscillating pressure mode that shall brighten and dim LEDs every 20 seconds.
  - 4) Mixed pressure mode that shall turn on first two increments when reached for 20 seconds and last two increments are in continuous mode.
- 11. HUD shall be field-removable and replaceable without use of special tools.



# Universal Air Connection (UAC)

- 1. System shall be capable of:
  - 1) Refill within immediately dangerous to life or health (IDLH) atmospheres.
  - Transfilling between two SCBA wearers (connection allows for donation and receipt of air), providing emergency breathing system (EBS) while maintaining NIOSH approvals.
  - 3) Quickly refilling (approximately one-minute duration) SCBA cylinder from mobile compressor, cascade system or RIT pack.

- 12. Pressure reducer shall have no more than 42 individual regulator replacement parts.
- 13. Pressure reducer shall not require special tools for disassembly.
- 14. Pressure reducer shall have two accessory ports, one medium pressure and one high pressure.

### Cylinders

- 1. Cyfinders must be available in 30-, 45- and 60-minute durations.
- 2. Cylinder shall be constructed of deep-drawn, seamless aluminum liner that is fully wound over entire surface (except for thick neck area) with high-strength carbon fiber filaments impregnated with epoxy resin.

Subject: Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) Purchase

Craig,

The fire department's SCBA committee headed by the Deputy Fire Chief, and members of the department evaluated multiple brands of SCBA's including the features offered, technological advances and the ability to upgrade the SCBA's to meet NFPA 1852 standards that are adopted every five (5) years. The committee decided to field test the MSA G1 SCBA 450 that is manufactured by Mine Safety Appliances (MSA) because of our history of using their brand of SCBA's and because MSA is the industry leader in SCBA's and offers the best combination of safety features, fit, and advanced technology. The department's current inventory of SCBA's are eleven (11) years old and after completing the annual testing in early summer it was the recommendation of the certified testers that we replace our entire inventory of SCBA's due to the significant wear and tear on our harnesses and the escalating number of repairs needed to maintain a sufficient number of serviceable SCBA's in our inventory for firefighters to use in environments that are dangerous to health and life safety of firefighters entering low oxygen environments.

Therefore, it is the recommendation of the fire department that we purchase eighty (80) complete sets of SCBA's from the local distributor of MSA products MACQUEEN EMEGENCY EQUIPMENT. The complete sets include eighty (80) spare, 45-minute bottles, one hundred-fifty (150) face pieces, and eighty (80) TIC's (Thermal Imaging Cameras). Additionally, the department is also purchasing eight (8) 60-minute harnesses, sixteen (16) 60-minute bottles for use in hazardous materials operations and eleven (11) Rapid Intervention Team (RIT) systems in the total amount of \$1,118,638,75. The department also plans to trade-in our current inventory of obsolete SCBA's and spare bottles for \$20,001.85 and the department will also purchase testing equipment and training for members of the department at a cost of \$19,035.00, which will allow us to perform the annual testing and repair of our SCBA systems saving the department approximately \$7,500.00 per year and \$75,000.00 over the minimum ten (10) year life expectancy of the new SCBA systems.

Sír,

Recently, the Warren Fire Department has conducted an in-depth analysis to ascertain the functionality and condition of our SCBA (Self Contained Breathing Apparatus) inventory. Required annual testing has been completed for all air bottles, SCBA harnesses, personal protective masks, and all related hardware necessary for the SCBA units to function. This includes inspections, hydrostatic air bottle tests, individual mask fit tests, and SCBA unit flow tests which specifically detect air leaks or component failure, conducted by professionally licensed technicians affiliated with MacQueen Emergency Equipment

The findings overwhelmingly indicate a dire need for new and upgraded SCBA personal protective equipment units. Most, if not all, of our SCBA units being currently used in the field are severely weathered and frayed from normal use and age. Maintenance and repairs were attempted by MacQueen technicians, and many were beyond repair or found to have exceeded or reached their life span which we are obligated by law to conform and adhere to. Much of the equipment was found to not be of any use to the technicians even for spare parts.

The Fire Department has entered serious negotiations with MacQueen Emergency Group to purchase the new G1 Self Contained Breathing Apparatus manufactured by MSA Safety Company. To test the G1 in real world scenarios, the firefighters at Station 2 have each been given a G1 unit to use on duty for nearly one year. Representatives from MSA, MacQueen, Warren Fire Department, and the firefighters from Station 2 have completed several in-person and remote meetings to discuss questions, comments, and concerns that arose during the G1 trial period. Meetings were also conducted to address options, pros vs cons, and pricing in detail over the course of many months. The final quote that is including here in was reached after painstaking fine tuning of the G1 to fit the needs of the Warren Fire Department, taking safety, cost, and practicality into consideration. The following will illustrate each facet of the MSA G1 SCBA as agreed to by the parties involved in the project.

The MSA G1 SCBA offers integrated and enhanced solutions to exceed our needs for today as well as in the future. Each SCBA unit comes with a new (PPE) personal protective mask and one (1) air bottle cylinder as agreed to by the sales representatives. We are requesting (80)- G1 SCBA units.

The mask, or face piece, is light-weight and compact, is comfortable and easy to use, with low breathing resistance and equipped with cross-contamination protection. The mask will offer the user a "heads up" display or HUD, consisting of LED lights which warn the firefighter of excessive heat conditions, breathing rate, oxygen use with time left to breathe, and cylinder pressure with cylinder pressure remaining in 4-increments via colored LED lights. Clear unmuffled voice capabilities are also state of the art due to integrated electronic communications that remove breathing noise.

The control module, which is activated by the user, is positioned along the front of the harness chest strap. The display interface will turn on automatically when lifted into viewing position, provides dual color LCD and analogue displays, and contains more data and functionality than any other of its kind.

The MSA G1 SCBA unit has improved visibility through buddy-lights and reflective material. Included are 4-buddy lights, 2-control module lights, and 1-regulator light.

The MSA G1 SCBA is ergonomic, with a swiveling and adjustable lumbar pad which evenly distributes weight, improving comfort and balance.

The central power system is rechargeable with a lightweight battery that utilizes a rapid smart charger device.

The MSA G1 SCBA unit will be outfitted with quick-connect hoses and cylinder attachments eliminating the possibility of loose or damaged threads.

Multiple easily upgradeable options are readily available for future use such as: Bluetooth, Near Field Communication, and long range radio features.

The control module and HUD display can be easily updated at any time with additional modes or to comply with NFPA standards.

The G1 SCBA units will be outfitted with a TIC (Thermal Imaging Camera) which is mounted on the front shoulder strap and is used by the firefighter to quickly find heat signatures in a hostile environment with 5 different screen palettes available. Buddy Breathing capabilities are possible with the Universal Air Connection System which allows a transfer of air between firefighters and their SCBA's in emergency situations. Also, a PASS (Personal Alert Safety System) device is integrated into the unit allowing a high decibel audible alarm to help locate trapped or incapacitated firefighters.

The air cylinders will be rated for 45-minute use, low profile, and have a capacity of 4500 psi. Each G1 SCBA will arrive with an H60 air cylinder as part of the purchase (80), plus, 1- free additional H60 air cylinder with each unit purchased per the limited time offer sales agreement with the MacQueen sales team. For a total of 160 H60 cylinders.

- 11. RIT (Rapid Intervention Team) assemblies. True-North L3 Speed Bag, air cylinder, mask, and emergency tubing for downed firefighter rescue.
- 8- MSA G1 CBRN-Hazardous Materials Level A suite SCBA units.
- 4- MSA G1 PREMAIRE assemblies. Confined Space Operations.
- 4-MSA Technical Rescue Air Cart cylinders. Confined Space Operations.
- 70- Additional MSA G1 Face-Piece units for all fire personnel including back-ups.
- 9- MSA G1 Battery Charging Stations
- 48- MSA G1 SCBA Lithium Batteries

MSA and MacQueen will also facilitate the Warren Fire Department with "train the trainer" courses and instruction, both in-house and at the main MSA Headquarters, giving the Warren Fire Department national accreditation in MSA G1 SCBA maintenance and repair standards.

We will also be credited with a \$20,000.00 dollar trade in value for our used air cylinders, masks, and harnesses as agreed to by the MacQueen sales agents.

The Warren Fire Department has an ideal opportunity to move forward and to be progressive with technical innovations and state of the art equipment for the firefighters out on the front lines. I have provided the quote information and an MSA G1 Specification packet which provides further detailed information. The total cost in the quote provided is \$1,118,638.75. MacQueen is our sole source vendor for MSA SCBA products, both sales and repair.

The "de minimis" rate may be applied only to modified total direct costs (MTDC) as defined by the Part 200 Uniform Requirements.

#### 14

Employment eligibility verification for hiring under the award

- The recipient (and any subrecipient at any tier) must--
- A. Ensure that, as part of the hiring process for any position within the United States that is or will be funded (in whole or in part) with award funds, the recipient (or any subrecipient) properly verifies the employment eligibility of the individual who is being hired, consistent with the provisions of 8 U.S.C. 1324a(a)(1).

### **GRANT**

This is Grant # E20240047-00 between the Michigan Indigent Defense Commission (Grantor), and <u>City of Warren</u> (Grantee), subject to terms and conditions of this grant agreement (Agreement).

### 1.0 Statement of Purpose

The purpose of this Grant is to provide funding to assist the Grantee (also referred to as local funding unit) to comply with the Compliance Plan and Cost Analysis approved by the MIDC for the provision of indigent criminal defense services through the minimum standards approved by LARA and the process described in the Michigan Indigent Defense Commission Act (MIDC Act). The funding for this grant is contingent upon an appropriation by the Legislature that is signed by the Governor. Consistent with the MIDC Act, in the event that the funds appropriated apply to less than all of the minimum standards, the funding unit will not be required to fully comply with all of the minimum standards. In the event that an appropriation is insufficient to fully fund this grant, the amount of the grant will be reduced by the Grantor and the funding unit will not be required to fully comply with the minimum standards the original approved grant was designed to allow.

### 1.1 Definitions

- A. Budget means the detailed statement of estimated costs approved as the Grantee's Cost Analysis and required to implement the Compliance Plan.
- B. Budget Category means the aggregate of all funds in each of the high-level categories within the approved Cost Analysis.
- C. Compliance Plan or Plan is the plan submitted by the local funding unit and approved by the MIDC that specifically addresses how the Grantee shall meet the approved minimum standards established by the MIDC.
- D. Cost Analysis is a statement of the types of expenditures and funding necessary to bring Grantee's indigent defense system into compliance with the approved minimum standards established by the MIDC, including a statement of the funds in excess of the Grantee's local share as defined under the MIDC Act and as outlined in the Compliance Plan.
- E. MIDC Act means the Michigan Indigent Defense Commission Act, Public Act 93 of 2013, MCL 780.991 et seq., as amended, enacted for the purpose of creating the Michigan Indigent Defense Commission and creating minimum standards for the local delivery of indigent criminal defense services that meet the constitutional requirements for the effective assistance of counsel.
- F. Subgrantee means a governmental agency or other legal entity to which an MIDC subgrant is awarded by the Grantee. Attorneys representing indigent defendants, including both public defenders and attorneys contracted to represent indigent defendants, public defender office employees, judges, magistrates, court personnel, and professional service contract vendors shall not be considered subgrantees.
- G. "Substantial Change" to a Compliance Plan is a change to the Plan or Cost Analysis that alters the method of meeting the objectives of the standard(s) in the approved Plan.

### 1.2 Statement of Work

The Grantee agrees to undertake, perform, and complete the services described in its approved Compliance Plan and in accordance with the MIDC Act, specifically all approved MIDC Standards. The Parties to this Agreement enter into this Agreement to facilitate the process described in the MIDC Act, which controls or supersedes any terms of this Agreement. Consistent with the Act and when applicable, an indigent criminal defense system shall comply with the terms of this Agreement in bringing its system into compliance with the minimum standards established by the MIDC within 180 days after receiving funds from the MIDC. Grantee may exceed 180 days for compliance with a specific item needed to meet minimum standards as set forth in the Act. Grantee's Compliance Plan, as submitted and approved by the MIDC, addresses the prescribed methods Grantee has chosen to provide indigent criminal defense services pursuant to MCL 780.993(3). Any substantial changes to the work described in the Compliance Plan must be submitted to the MIDC for approval as set forth in this Agreement prior to any changes being implemented. All provisions and requirements of this Agreement shall apply to any agreements the Grantee may enter into in furtherance of its obligations under this Agreement and Grantee shall be responsible for the performance of any Subgrantee work, as defined in subsection1.1.

### 1.3 Detailed Budget

- A. This Agreement does not commit the State of Michigan (State) or the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA) to approve requests for additional funds at any time.
- B. If applicable, travel expenses will not be reimbursed at rates greater than the State Travel Rates, without the prior written consent of the MIDC.
- C. The Grantee agrees that all funds are to be spent as detailed in the Budget, unless a budget adjustment request is approved. See section 1.3(E).
- D. Grantee will maintain a restricted fund within their Local Chart of Accounts for the sole purpose of accounting for the expenses and revenue sources for operation of this grant and the local adult indigent defense system.
- E. All requests for a budget adjustment or substantial changes to the Grantee's Compliance Plan will be submitted quarterly with the Grantee's quarterly report. MIDC staff shall respond to a request in writing within 30 days of receipt.
  - 1) Budget adjustments less than or equal to 5% of the Budget Category total, including adjustments between Budget Categories, do not require approval by MIDC staff, but must be reported quarterly in the next financial status report.
  - A Budget adjustment involving greater than 5% of the aggregate of all funding within a Budget Category requires prior written approval by MIDC Staff and must be reported to the MIDC as soon after the Grantee is aware of the necessity of the Budget adjustment and reported in the Grantee's quarterly report.
  - Any substantial change to a Compliance Plan requires prior approval by MIDC staff and MIDC Commission.

### 1.4 Payment Schedule

The maximum amount of grant assistance approved is \$3,479,382.35 (Three Million Four Hundred Seventy Nine Thousand Three Hundred Eighty Two and 35/100)

Grantee must report and certify to Grantor by October 31st of each year the balance of any unexpended indigent defense grant funds from the prior fiscal year grant plus any interest earned on the advancement of the state grant funds in the previous fiscal year. Any funds from the previous fiscal year contained in an approved extension of the previous fiscal year's grant for projects that will be completed after September 30, 2023, will be carried over into the current fiscal year and shall not be considered unexpended funds, nor be included in the balance of unexpended funds. The current fiscal year indigent defense grant funds advanced will be reduced by the amount of unexpended funds from the prior fiscal year's grant by reducing the 2nd and 3rd disbursement equally. The maximum amount of grant assistance approved includes the unexpended funds reported from the previous fiscal year.

An initial advance of 25% of the State Grant shall be made to the Grantee upon receipt by the Grantor of a signed Agreement. The Grantor shall make subsequent disbursements of up to 25% of the total state grant amount in accordance with the following schedule:

Initial Advance of 25% of total grant – Within 15 days of receipt of executed agreement

25% disbursement - January 15, 2024

25% disbursement - April 15, 2024

25% disbursement – July 15, 2024 (final payment)

The above schedule of disbursement of funds is contingent upon receipt of quarterly reporting as addressed in this section and section 1.5 of this document. Any disputed matters shall not cause delay in remitting any disbursements or in issuing a grant contract and funds for the next fiscal year. Disputed matters shall be acted on independently from undisputed matters. The financial status report (FSR) report must be submitted on the form provided by the MIDC/LARA and indicate:

Grant funds received to date;

Expenditures for the reporting period by budget category; and;

Cumulative expenditures to date by budget category;

The quarterly FSR must be supported and accompanied by documentation of those grant funded expenditures incurred for the reporting period, including but not limited to:

The general ledger for the restricted local indigent defense fund, including a
detailed expenditure report with all expenditure detail within the budget
categories, which must include documentation of payments to contract
attorneys either by individual invoice or by report of payments made, by
attorney;

- All invoices related to experts and investigators;
- All invoices related to construction; and
- Personnel detail including full-time equivalency of any grant funded positions, including total compensation for that position;

Invoices are to be provided by contract or non-employee Managed Assigned Counsel Administrators and for all contract attorneys providing direct service representation in the manner or rate in which the service is approved in the cost analysis for the indigent defense system, to track time in hourly increments where hourly rates are provided and provide specific details regarding the services performed for the billing period.

Upon request, Grantee shall provide the MIDC with additional documentation/verification of expenditures under the grant within 30 days of the making of the request. Any additional documentation/verification of expenditures shall not delay issuance of a grant contract or grant disbursements. Grantee's documentation of expenditures shall be maintained according to record retention policies for audit purposes in order to comply with this Agreement. Grantee will be held to the full contribution of the Local Share within the original one-year grant period.

The quarterly FSR and standards compliance report as addressed in Section 1.5, shall be provided in accordance with the following schedule:

Initial FSR and compliance report for 10/1/23 - 12/31/23 - January 31, 2024

2nd FSR and compliance report for 1/1/24 - 3/31/24 - April 30, 2024

3rd FSR and compliance report for 4/1/24 - 6/30/24 - July 31, 2024

Final FSR and compliance report for 7/1/24 - 9/30/24 - October 31,2024

### 1,5 Monitoring and Reporting Program Performance

- A. Monitoring. The Grantee shall monitor performance to assure that time schedules are being met and projected work is being accomplished.
- B. Quarterly Reports. The Grantee shall submit to the Grantor quarterly program reports on compliance with the minimum standards and participate in follow up and evaluation activities. Compliance reports include narrative responses containing a description of the Grantee's compliance with all approved MIDC Standards, identifying problems or delays, actual, real or anticipated and any significant deviation from the approved Compliance Plan. Grantee will use its best efforts to provide data relevant to assessing compliance as contained in the compliance reporting template requested by MIDC. If Grantee is unable to provide the information requested by the report, Grantee will demonstrate in writing the steps taken to assess what information is currently available and how to retrieve it. Grantee also agrees to work with MIDC research staff to seek additional options or ideas for the collection and retrieval of this information.

### PART II - GENERAL PROVISIONS

### 2.1 Project Changes

Grantee must obtain prior written approval for substantial changes to the compliance plan from Grantor.

### 2.2 Delegation

Grantee must notify the MIDC at least 90 calendar days before any proposed delegation with reasonable detail about Subgrantee and the nature and scope of the activities delegated. If any obligations under this Grant are delegated, Grantee must: (a) be the sole point of contact regarding all contractual project matters, including payment and charges for all Grant activities; (b) make all payments to the Subgrantee; and (c) incorporate the terms and conditions contained in this Grant in any subgrant with Subgrantee. Grantee remains responsible for the completion of the Grant activities and compliance with the terms of this Grant.

### 2.3 Program Income

To the extent that it can be determined that interest was earned on advances of funds, such interest shall be recorded in the Grantee's restricted indigent defense fund and included in the quarterly FSRs. The grant award shall not be increased by the amount of interest earned. Any grant funds attributable to interest and not spent at the end of the grant period shall be returned to the State or included in future grant awards from the MIDC consistent with MCL 780.993(15).

### 2.4 Share-in-savings

Grantor expects to share in any cost savings realized by Grantee in proportion of the grant funds to the local share.

### 2.5 Purchase of Equipment

The purchase of equipment must be made pursuant to Grantee's established purchasing policy and if not specifically listed in the Budget, Grantee must have prior written approval of Grantor. Equipment is defined as non-expendable personal property having a useful life of more than one year. Such equipment shall be retained by Grantee unless otherwise specified at the time of approval.

### 2.6 Accounting

Grantee must establish and maintain a restricted indigent defense fund in its local chart of accounts to record all transactions related to the Grant. The restricted fund will not lapse to the local general fund at the close of Grantee's fiscal year. Grantee shall adhere to the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles and shall maintain records which will allow, at a minimum, for the comparison of actual outlays with budgeted amounts. Grantee's overall financial management system must ensure effective control over and accountability for all indigent defense funds received. Where the Grantee uses a nonprofit entity to provide indigent defense services as contemplated in its compliance plan and cost analysis, the Grantee shall ensure that the contract or agreement defining the nonprofit entities relationship allows for reasonable access, in its sole discretion, to financial records for monitoring by the Grantee and its representatives. Accounting records must be supported by source documentation of expenditures including, but not limited to, balance sheets, general

ledgers, payroll documents, time sheets and invoices. The expenditure of state funds shall be reported by line item and compared to the Budget.

### 2.7 Records Maintenance, Inspection, Examination, and Audit

Grantor or its designee may audit Grantee and the restricted indigent defense fund account to verify compliance with this Grant. Grantee must retain and provide to Grantor or its designee upon request, all financial and accounting records related to the Grant through the term of the Grant and for 7 years after the latter of termination, expiration, or final payment under this Grant or any extension ("Audit Period"). If an audit, litigation, or other action involving the records is initiated before the end of the Audit Period, Grantee must retain the records until all issues are resolved.

Within 10 calendar days of providing notice, Grantor and its authorized representatives or designees have the right to enter and inspect Grantee's premises or any other places where Grant activities are being performed, and examine, copy, and audit all records related to this Grant. Grantee must cooperate and provide reasonable assistance. If any financial errors have occurred, the amount in error must be reflected as a credit or debit on subsequent disbursements until the amount is paid or refunded. Any remaining balance must be reported by Grantee to Grantor by October 31 of each year as required under the MIDC Act.

This Section applies to Grantee, any parent, affiliate, or subsidiary organization of Grantee, and any subgrantee that performs Grant activities in connection with this Grant.

### 2.8 Competitive Bidding

Grantee agrees that all procurement transactions involving the use of state funds shall be conducted in a manner that provides maximum open and free competition, consistent with Grantee's purchasing policies. Sole source contracts should be negotiated to the extent that such negotiation is possible. Attorney contracts for representation of indigent or partially indigent defendants, and contracts for managed assigned counsel coordinators, are exempt from a competitive bid process but must meet standard internal procurement policies, as applicable.

### 3.0 Liability

The State is not liable for any costs incurred by Grantee before the start date or after the end date of this Agreement. Liability of the State is limited to the terms and conditions of this Agreement and the total grant amount.

### 3.1 Safety

Grantee and all subgrantees are responsible for ensuring that all precautions are exercised at all times for the protection of persons and property. Safety provisions of all Applicable Laws and building and construction codes shall be observed. Grantee and every subgrantee are responsible for compliance with all federal, state, and local laws and regulations in any manner affecting the work or performance of this Agreement and shall at all times carefully observe and comply with all rules, ordinances, and regulations. Grantee, and all subgrantees shall secure all necessary certificates and permits from municipal or other public authorities as may be required in connection with the performance of this Agreement.

### 3.2 Indemnification

Each party to the Grant must seek its own legal representation and bear its own legal costs; including judgments, in any litigation which may arise from the performance of this Grant and/or Agreement. It is specifically understood and agreed that neither party will indemnify the other party in any such litigation.

### 3.3 Failure to Comply and Termination

A. Failure to comply with duties and obligations under the grant program as set forth in Public Act 93 of 2013, as amended, is subject to the procedures contained in sections 15 and 17 of the Act.

### B. Termination for Convenience

Grantor may immediately terminate this Grant in whole or in part without penalty and for any reason, including but not limited to, appropriation or budget shortfalls. If Grantor terminates this Grant for convenience, Grantor will pay all reasonable costs for approved Grant responsibilities. If the parties cannot agree to the cost to be paid by the Grantor, the parties shall attempt to resolve the dispute by mediation pursuant to MCL 780.995. Grantee's duty to comply with MIDC standards is limited to funding covering the cost of compliance as set forth in the Act.

### 3.4 Conflicts and Ethics

Grantee will uphold high ethical standards and is prohibited from: (a) holding or acquiring an interest that would conflict with this Grant; (b) doing anything that creates an appearance of impropriety with respect to the award or performance of the Grant; (c) attempting to influence or appearing to influence any State employee by the direct or indirect offer of anything of value; or (d) paying or agreeing to pay any person, other than employees and consultants working for Grantee, any consideration contingent upon the award of the Grant. Grantee must immediately notify Grantor of any violation or potential violation of this Section. This Section applies to Grantee, any parent, affiliate, or subsidiary organization of Grantee, and any subgrantee that performs Grant activities in connection with this Grant.

### 3.5 Non-Discrimination

Under the Elliott-Larsen Civil Rights Act, 1976 PA 453, MCL 37.2101 to 37.2804, and the Persons with Disabilities Civil Rights Act, 1976 PA 220, MCL 37.1101, et seq., Grantee and its subgrantees agree not to discriminate against an employee or applicant for employment with respect to hire, tenure, terms, conditions, or privileges of employment, or a matter directly or indirectly related to employment, because of race, color, religion, national origin, age, sex, height, weight, marital status, partisan considerations, or a disability or genetic information that is unrelated to the person's ability to perform the duties of a particular job or position. Breach of this covenant is a material breach of this Grant.

### 3.6 Unfair Labor Practices

Under MCL 423.324, the State may void any Grant with a grantee or subgrantee who appears on the Unfair Labor Practice register compiled under MCL 423.322.

### 3.7 Force Majeure

Neither party will be in breach of this Grant because of any failure arising from any disaster or act of God that are beyond its control and without its fault or negligence. Each party will use commercially reasonable efforts to resume performance. Grantee will not be relieved of a breach or delay caused by its subgrantees except where the MIDC determines that an unforeseeable condition prohibits timely compliance pursuant to MCL 780.993, Sec. 13(11).

### 4.0 Certification Regarding Debarment

Grantee certifies, by signature to this Agreement, that neither it nor its principals are presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this Agreement by any federal or state department or agency. If Grantee is unable to certify to any portion of this statement, Grantee shall attach an explanation to this Agreement.

### 4.1 Illegal Influence

Grantee certifies, to the best of its knowledge and belief that:

- A. No federal appropriated funds have been paid nor will be paid, by or on behalf of Grantee, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any federal contract, the making of any federal grant, the making of any federal loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any federal contract, grant, loan or cooperative agreement.
- B. If any funds other than federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with this grant, the Grantee shall complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions.
- C. Grantee shall require that the language of this certification be included in the award documents for all grants or subcontracts and that all subrecipients shall certify and disclose accordingly.

The State has relied upon this certification as a material representation. Submission of this certification is a prerequisite for entering into this Agreement imposed by 31 USC 1352. Any person who fails to file the required certification shall be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$10,000 and not more than \$100,000 for each such failure.

Grantee certifies, to the best of its knowledge and belief that no state funds have been paid nor will be paid, by or on behalf of Grantee, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any state agency, a member of the Legislature, or an employee of a member of the Legislature in connection with the awarding of any state contract, the making of any state grant, the making of any state

loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any state contract, grant, loan or cooperative agreement.

### 4.2 Governing Law

This Grant is governed, construed, and enforced in accordance with Michigan law, excluding choice-of-law principles. All claims relating to, or arising out of, this Grant are governed by Michigan law, excluding choice-of-law principles. Any dispute arising from this Grant must be resolved as outlined in Sec. 15 of PA93 of 2013, as amended.

### 4.3 Disclosure of Litigation, or Other Proceeding

Grantee must notify Grantor within 14 calendar days of receiving notice of any litigation, investigation, arbitration, or other proceeding (collectively Proceeding) that arises during the term of the Grant against a public defender office, an attorney employed by a public defender office, or an attorney contracted to perform indigent defense functions funded by the Grantee that involves: (a) a criminal Proceeding; (b) a civil Proceeding involving a claim that, after consideration of Grantee's insurance coverages, would adversely affect Grantee's viability; (c) a civil Proceeding involving a governmental or public entity's claim or written allegation of fraud related to performance of the Grant; or (d) a Proceeding challenging any license that an attorney practicing on behalf of a public defender office or an attorney practicing pursuant to a contract to perform indigent defense functions for Grantee is required to possess in order to perform under this Grant.

### 4.4 Assignment

Grantee may not assign this Grant to any other party without the prior approval of Grantor. Upon notice to Grantee, Grantor, in its sole discretion, may assign in whole or in part, its rights or responsibilities under this Grant to any other party. If Grantor determines that a novation of the Grant to a third party is necessary, Grantee will agree to the novation, provide all necessary documentation and signatures, and continue to perform its obligations under the Grant.

### 4.5 Entire Grant and Modification

This Grant is the entire agreement and replaces all previous agreements between the parties for the Grant activities. Pursuant to the MIDC Act, the MIDC shall promulgate policies necessary to carry out its powers and duties. The MIDC may also provide guides, instructions, informational pamphlets for the purpose of providing guidance and information with regard to the Grant and MIDC policies. This Agreement supersedes all terms of MIDC policies, guides, instructions, informational pamphlets and any other explanatory material that is in conflict with the Agreement. This Agreement may not be amended except by a signed written agreement between the parties.

### 4.6 Grantee Relationship

Grantee assumes all rights, obligations, and liabilities set forth in this Grant. Grantee, its employees, and its agents will not be considered employees of the State. No partnership or joint venture relationship is created by virtue of this Grant. Grantee,

and not Grantor or the State of Michigan, is responsible for the payment of wages, benefits, and taxes of Grantee's employees. Prior performance does not modify Grantee's status as an independent grantee.

### 4.7 Dispute Resolution

The parties will endeavor to resolve any Grant dispute in accordance with section 15 of Public Act 93 of 2013. The dispute will be referred to the parties' respective representatives or program managers. Such referral must include a description of the issues and all supporting documentation. The parties will continue performing while a dispute is being resolved, unless the dispute precludes performance or performance would require Grantee to spend in excess of the Local Share as defined by MCL 780.983(h).

### 5.0 Severability

If any part of this Grant is held invalid or unenforceable, by any court of competent jurisdiction, that part will be deemed deleted from this Grant and the severed part will be replaced by agreed upon language that achieves the same or similar objectives. The remaining Grant will continue in full force and effect.

### 5.1 Signatories

The signatories warrant that they are empowered to enter into this Agreement and agree to be bound by it.
