Small Business Support Hub Grant(SBSH)

Velocity was awarded \$1.8M by the MEDC to support small businesses adversely impacted by COVID-19 in Macomb County through:

Velocity SBSH Who Qualifies?

Macomb County based businesses and early-stage entrepreneurs planning on starting a business in Macomb County and at least one of the following:

Geography

The business is located in a designated area such as a 2015 CDFI Investment Tract, 2020 Qualified Census Tract, or Rural Michigan County.

SEDI Owned

51% Majority ownership by: Woman, Minority, Veteran, LGBTQ+, Disabled, or **Underserved Pop.**

Impacted by COVID-19

The business can demonstrate a disproportionate negative economic impact as a result of COVID-19.

SEDI Definition

The business meets the US Treasury definition of SEDI-owned (Socially and Economically Disadvantaged Individuals).

SEDI Definition-Business enterprises that certify that they are owned and controlled by individuals who have had their access to credit on reasonable terms diminished as compared to others in comparable economic circumstances, due to their: (1) membership of a group that has been subjected to racial or ethnic prejudice or cultural bias within American society; (2) gender; (3) veteran status; (4) limited English proficiency; (5) physical handicap; (6) long-term residence in an environment isolated from the mainstream of American society; (7) membership of a federally or state-recognized Indian Tribe; (8) long-term residence in a rural community; (9) residence in a U.S. territory; (10) residence in a community undergoing economic transitions (including communities impacted by the shift towards a net-zero economy or deindustrialization); or (11) membership of another "underserved community". (Underserved communities are populations sharing a particular characteristic, as well as geographic communities, that have been systematically denied a full opportunity to participate in aspects of economic, social, and civic life, as exemplified by the list in the definition of equity. Equity is consistent and systematic fair, just, and impartial treatment of all individuals, including individuals who belong to underserved communities that have been denied such treatment, such as Black, Latino, and Indigenous and Native American persons, Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders and other persons of color; members of religious minorities; lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer (LGBTQ+) persons; persons with disabilities; persons who live in rural areas; and persons otherwise adversely affected by persistent poverty or inequality.)

- My business had to shut down or reduce hours during the COVID-19 pandemic due to required closings, lack of childcare, etc.
- Notice of Business Closure
- > My business had to lay off staff due to the COVID-19 pandemic
- Termination letter occurred between March 16th, 2020- May 11th, 2021
- My business experienced unexpected cost increases (for personal protective equipment, making changes to meet social distancing requirements, etc.) due to the COVID-19 pandemic
- At least 5 receipts (total max of \$1,000) of purchases occurred between March 16th, 2020- May 11th, 2021
- ➤ My business had a decline in gross revenues between 2019-2022
