



Investigation into Ashley Elkins Disappearance Continues – Several leads being actively pursued by several law enforcement agencies

The Warren Police Department and Roseville Police Department are providing an update regarding the disappearance of 30-year-old Ashley Elkins of Warren. Ms. Elkins was reported missing by her family members to the Warren Police Department on Friday (01/03/2025) after she was last reported leaving her residence in Warren on Thursday (01/02/2025) morning.

The Warren Police Department immediately initiated an investigation upon receiving the original missing person's report. Preliminary indications suggested that Ms. Elkins may have been at an apartment within the Hampton Court Apartments in Roseville, the residence of her ex-boyfriend. The Roseville Police Department was promptly contacted and responded to this location with Warren investigators however, neither Ms. Elkins nor her boyfriend were located at the apartment. Subsequent investigative efforts by both departments have been extensive. To date, the Warren Police Department has executed nearly 20 search warrants, conducted comprehensive video canvasses, examined numerous pieces of digital evidence, and conducted numerous interviews with friends and family members. The Roseville Police Department has also dedicated numerous resources to this very important investigation.

On Tuesday (01/07/2025), it was determined that there was a strong possibility of foul play involved in this incident, likely occurring within the City of Roseville at the Hampton Court Apartments. As such, the Roseville Police Department assumed the lead investigative role, while the Warren Police Department continues to actively assist. On Tuesday, a search warrant was executed at the Hampton Court Apartments with the assistance of the Michigan State Police Forensic Team. Significant evidence, including forensics, was recovered and will be further analyzed by the Michigan State Police. Ms. Elkins' vehicle, a silver Chevy Malibu, was recovered in the area of 13 Mile and Little Mack. Additionally, a trash dumpster from the Hampton Court Apartments was also seized for investigative and evidentiary purposes.

The Roseville Police Department and Warren Police Department are actively pursuing numerous leads and remain in contact with Ms. Elkins' family. This is an ongoing and active investigation and we understand the media and public's interest. We kindly request patience, as thorough investigations and due process require careful attention to detail. Further updates will be provided to the media as they become available.
