The City of Warren and the Warren Fire Department invite members of the media to cover the grand opening of the new Fire Station No. 5 - a modern, purpose-built facility designed to support the department's expanding mission and enhance emergency response for the city's northeast side.

This celebration will include a ceremonial apparatus parade, a formal dedication ceremony, and a community open house with tours and displays. The day also pays tribute to the proud legacy of the original Station 5 - "Consigney Hall" - which opened in 1958 and faithfully served the community for more than 67 years.

Department leadership.

12:30 PM - 7:00 PM - Community Open House

Facility tours, equipment displays, firefighter meet-and-greets, and a historical exhibit celebrating the legacy of Station No. 5, including archival photos and memorabilia.
