# WARREN PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES Wednesday, July 16, 2025

**Call to order:** Meeting called to order by Commissioner Salka at 6:33pm

**Approval of Agenda**: A motion by Commissioner Sawka, seconded by Commissioner Frederick to approve the Agenda. The motion passed unanimously.

**Vote on approval of April 16, 2025 Minutes**: A motion by Commissioner Dalpra, seconded by Commissioner Chapp to approve the minutes from April 16, 2025. The motion passed unanimously.

### **Old Business:**

# A. Update on Skate Park and Splash Pad

- Phase two of the skate park is on track to be completed sometime in August. The specific opening date is not yet set.
- Funding has been approved to renovate the restrooms at the park, and the contractor is expected to begin work shortly
- Phase three, which includes benches, amenities, and signs, is planned for the end of the year or the beginning of next year.
- A gate still needs to be installed at the park, which is outside the current project's scope.

### Splash Pad Project

- The splash pad will not open this month as originally scheduled due to several setbacks.
- The project has experienced problems with the subcontractor responsible for installing the splash pad equipment, which is identified as the primary source of issues, including material delays.
- The project was also set back by vandalism, where individuals cut wires and smashed a couple of pumps.
- The primary contractor for the project is Great Lakes Recreation.
- The restrooms at the splash pad were renovated and are planned to be opened for public use.
- A police report was filed by the contractor regarding the vandalism at the splash pad.
- To improve security, new cameras will be installed as part of a 90-day trial.
- One camera will be placed at the splash pad.
- Two bullet cameras will be installed at the skate park.

## **B.** Playscape and Park Renovations

- - A new universal playscape has opened and is receiving positive public feedback, with visitors appreciating the AstroTurf over previous pebble surfaces.
- The department plans to build three more playscapes
- A large, \$800,000 playscape is planned for Halmich.
- Three smaller, \$250,000 playscapes are planned for Rentz, Altermatt and Jaycee Parks.
- Discussion from a resident of Altermatt Park neighborhood expressed dissatisfaction with the park's declining quality.
- Planned renovations for Altermatt Park include a new playscape, redoing the asphalt walkway to meet ADA compliance, and adding new park furnishings.
- A comprehensive 5 year plan is due in 2026, which will provide residents an opportunity for formal input on park needs.

### C. Veteran's Park Pickleball & Basketball Court

- New pickleball and basketball courts are in the final phases of engineering and are expected to break ground in late summer.
- The department held meetings with the pickleball community to gather input on the new court design, which was incorporated into the engineering plans, addressing concerns about fencing and restrooms.

#### **New Business:**

# A. Department Budget and Staffing for FY 2026

- The total approved revenue for the fiscal year 2026 is \$6,373,611. Budget details are available online at cityofwarren.org.
- The department has undergone a budget-neutral restructuring of its staff, effective July 1.
- The Events/Sports Coordinator position was promoted to an Events Facility Administrator, responsible for events and all facilities.
- A new Sports Supervisor will be hired to focus on improving the sports program.
- Two full-time maintenance employees were promoted to Maintenance Technicians to manage the maintenance program, as there is no foreman position.
- The Park Supervisor position was eliminated.
- The department currently has nine full-time employees.
- It has no secretary or accountant, with existing staff handling these duties.

- Renovation of Halmich Park.
- o Installation of two new play structures:
  - \*\*Lick Park:\*\*Universal playscape with pour-and-play, expected completion in spring.
  - \*\*Veterans Park:\*\*Challenge playscape with a rope course, opened in November, received positive feedback on social media.
- Nine-hole disc golf course at Steinhauser Park, well-received, with temporary restroom facilities.
- o Reopening of Owen Jax Community Center with senior activities and other programs.

# • Future Goals for 2025:

- o Renovate north and south restroom facilities.
- o Design and build a pickleball court at Veterans Park.
- o Repave parking lot at Warren Community Center.
- o Expand city transportation services for residents, including field trips.
- o Reorganize Parks and Recreation Department structure.
- o Complete skate park and splash pad.
- o Renovate or remove the stadium from Warren Community Center.

## **B.** Tree Inventory

- The city received a grant to conduct a city-wide public tree inventory and purchase new trees.
- The project will begin with a meeting on the 28th, and the inventory work is scheduled to start in early August, lasting six months.
- The goal is to increase the city's overall tree canopy to 20-22%, with a specific target to increase the street tree canopy from its current 18% to a minimum of 25%.
- The inventory data will be integrated directly into the city's GIS system and used to apply for future grants for tree purchase, management, and maintenance.

# C. Community Engagement and Programming

- A recent "Mayoral Light on the Parks and Rec Department" event was well-received, though attendance was low (around 25 people). The event showcased the department's extensive programming and staff involvement.
- An open house and ice cream social for seniors is scheduled for September 18 to gather input on programming needs via a survey. This event will be advertised in the "Warren Today Program" publication.
- The department is open to residents from Centerline and Sterling Heights.
- Discussions are underway with Sterling Heights about potential cross-programming opportunities, leveraging their dedicated senior center and other resources for mutual exchange.

**Adjournment:** Motion to adjourn was made at 7:07pm by Commissioner Dalpra, seconded by Commissioner Fredrick. The motion passed unanimously.
