## Fire Safety Tips

Recreational burnings in the city of Warren is strictly regulated by ordinance. Open burning of dry, seasoned firewood, wood pellets, artificial burning logs, briquettes shall only occur in fire pits, chimeneas or outdoor fire places.

Recreational outdoor burning must be monitored at all times, have an extinguishing source readily available (water hose, fire extinguisher, bucket of water / dirt) and must be conducted at least 15 feet from any structure.

Smoke alarms should be placed on the ceilings of each bedroom and one (1) additional smoke detector should also be installed on the ceiling of a common area on each floor of the residential dwelling but not in the kitchen or bathroom.

Carbon monoxide detectors should be installed in or near a furnace or laundry room. Carbon monoxide detectors should also be installed on the ceiling (hard wired with battery back-up or battery operated) of each floor or if a plug-in model in a receptor that is approximately 18 inches from the door.

## Up To \$500 Fine For Violating Warren's Fireworks Regulations

### Seven Important Rules For A Safe 4<sup>th</sup> of July



Fireworks are allowed from Sunday, June 28<sup>th</sup> thru Sunday, July 5<sup>th</sup>  
from 8:00 p.m. until 11:00 p.m.



- Fireworks cannot be discharged while under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs (zero tolerance).
- Minors under the age of 18 are prohibited from discharging fireworks with the exception of low impact fireworks (example: sparklers) under the supervision of a parent or guardian.
- Fireworks cannot be discharged on any street in Warren. Traffic cannot be impeded at any time.
- Discharge of fireworks prohibited in any public park, school property, city streets and sidewalks and easements, including the ITC corridor.
- Discharge of fireworks cannot disrupt the public peace and cannot cause debris on private and public property.
- Discharging fireworks prohibited within 30 ft. of any house, structure, building, vehicle or landscaping.
- **After 11 pm, Warren police will enforce violation of disturbing the peace.**

Warren residents and businesses **ONLY** are invited to a free document shredding day Saturday, July 18 from 9 a.m. – 1 p.m. at Warren City Hall. **I.D.'s are required.**

Please put all boxes or paper bags in your trunk, remain in your vehicle and a worker will take the boxes/bags. **No plastic bags please.**

Examples of items that can be shredded are invoices, bank statements, cancelled checks, tax returns, contracts, personal papers, etc.

We ask that each vehicle have a **limit of 5 bags or boxes**. Paper clips, binder clips and staples **do not** need to be removed.

Cardboard boxes will be collected, and all shredded documents will be recycled. The shredding will be done by ShredCorp Company. For more information, contact Wendy (586) 574-4509.
